The days of the week for noho vary due to the Te Wānanga o Raukawa calendar. Successful students will enter at year 2. Each year, there are:

- Four 3 day noho. Three in Ōtaki, one online. These are compulsory.
- Four Specialist Whakaakoranga papers
- One Iwi and Hapū paper per year although there are two in year two as Iwi and Hapū is not part of the year one RPL accreditation.
- One observation visit per year
