E whakanuia ana te kaupapa o Whakatupuranga Rua Mano he moemoeā i takoto mai i te 1975, e kawē tonu nei i te wairua, te mātauranga, me te mana o ō tātou tūpuna.

Our theme for Te Rā Whakapūmau 2025 is Whakatupuranga Rua Mano. This year we celebrate 50 years since its visionary inception, led by Emeritus Professor Whatarangi Winiata and the Raukawa Marae Trustees in 1975. This laid the foundation through which Te Wānanga o Raukawa was conceived.

We honour and acknowledge the bold and courageous vision of our leaders, and we reconfirm the enduring relevance of Whakatupuranga Rua Mano and its founding principles that continue to guide and inspire us today.

Kāti kia hoki mai rā te wāhi ki a tātou e takatū nei i te nukuroa o te whenua, tātou e huihui tahi mai ana i te rangi nei, ki Te Rā Whakapūmau, nau mai, haere mai. Tēnei anō hoki rā te whakamānawa atu nei i ngā tauira e puta ai te ihu i Te Wānanga o Raukawa i te rangi nei, e whakapūmautia mai ana ki ngā tohu mātauranga ki mua tonu i te aroaro o ngā Purutanga Mauri, arā, ko ngā kuia koroua e whakakanohitia ana ngā iwi e toru o Te Kotahitanga me ō tātou hapū, marae katoa.

He rā nui tēnei mō ngā ākonga kua oti i a rātou ngā tohu mātauranga te whakatutuki. Kia mana ai tā rātou whakaūtanga ki Te Ara a Tāwhaki e kōrerotia nei. I puritia ai e rātou te aka matua kauaka rā ko te aka tāepa. Kua puta rā ki Te Wheiao, ki Te Taiao, ki Te Ao Mārama. Heoi anō, ehara i te mea nō ngā ākonga anake te tino whakawhiwhinga, te tino rawenga. Nō ngā iwi, ngā hapū, ngā hāpori me ngā kura anō hoki ngā hua o te heke a mōtuhi.

Koutou ngā ākonga e whakapūmautia ana i tēnei rā, ka mea atu au he tīmatanga tēnei. Arā atu, arā atu anō ngā kōeke o te wānanga hei whakapikinga, hei whakakakenga mā koutou hei ngā tau e tū mai nei. Tēnā, whakatinanahia ngā mātauranga, ngā mōhiotanga, ngā māramatanga o te wānanga hei oranga mōu, mō tātou katoa. Ā, kia kua hoki rā e mutu takiwā noa iho nei ngā mahi i te wānanga. Engari whāia kia tukuna whakareretia iho ngā hua o te wānanga, mai i tētahi whakatupuranga ki tētahi anō. Hei whakatutuki ake i te whare whakamihhi, whakapūmau i te rangi nei, e huri tonu mai ana ngā whakaaro ki te kaupapa nāna nei te kākano whakatupu mō tō tātou nei wānanga. I te huringa tau o Whakatupuranga Rua Mano i tēnei tau, me tōna tīmatanga i te tau 1975, ka tika kia whakanuia e tātou tēnei pou whakamaharatanga nui taioreore.

It is with a deep sense of pride that we welcome you to Te Wānanga o Raukawa to join us in recognising and celebrating the outstanding achievements of each of our graduates today. They have all successfully met the scholarly requirements that our wānanga has required of them throughout the course of their studies with us. TAONGA INFORMATION FOR GRADUANDS

The taonga for heke (Undergraduate Diplomas) is a punga (anchor) with feathers attached. The anchor symbolises being secured to the earth so that the waka does not drift with the tides. The feathers symbolise the flight of birds. Therefore, although we remain grounded and do not drift off course, our minds are free to soar with the birds.

The taonga for poutuarongo (undergraduate degrees) is a patu symbolising courage and the taking up of the various causes and issues of our people.

The taonga for poutāhū (postgraduate diplomas) is a pou whenua, which symbolises the skilled combatant who can wield the two-handed weapon to his or her advantage.

The taonga for tāhuhu (postgraduate degrees) is a tewhatewha, which symbolises preparedness for chiefly leadership roles. Though it is a weapon it was more commonly used as a means of communicating a leader's intent and as an accompaniment in oratory.

Graduands who have already received a taonga for the same level qualification or higher in previous years, will not be offered another taonga. Attaining this level of qualification has already been acknowledged with taonga.

The creators of the taonga are:

Jean Kahui created the punga, and Te Pikikōtuku Tahupārae prepared and attached the muka and huruhuru.

Brian Climie, Hone Underwood, Thomas Te Whaiti Henry, Renee Pewhairangi and Jody Burgess created the patu, and Matene Climie, Mareikura Bevan and Azriel Ratu prepared and attached the muka.

Kereama Wanoa, Marty Hawkins, Toni Hawea and Aimee Porteners created the pouwhenua.

Kristofor Corkran created the tewhatewha, and Hinepuororangi Tahupārae prepared and attached the puhi.

TE ŌHĀKĪ

‘He kōrero, he tohutohu whakamutunga nā te tangata i mua i tōna matenga’.

Te Ōhākī represents the embodiment of the dying wish of Ngāpera Wi Kohika, a former staff member of Te Wānanga o Raukawa. Her request was that we should all learn from her experience in suffering from smoking related illnesses, which contributed directly to her loss of life.

Te Wānanga o Raukawa has committed to the goal of an entire student and staff population free from the irreversible effects of carcinogens, poisons and toxins contained within cigarettes and tobacco. Māori have suffered disproportionately from smoking related illnesses since tobacco first arrived in Aotearoa over 200 years ago. As a tikanga and kaupapa based institution, we believe in the potential of Te Ōhākī to assume a greater level of rangatiratanga over our collective health and wellbeing.

We aim to provide those of our students who smoke with the support, tools and knowledge to be able to work towards a lifestyle that is totally free from smoking. Ultimately, our broader goal is that all Te Wānanga o Raukawa students and graduates will be in a strong position to positively influence whānau in making informed decisions around wellbeing and good health.

Graduates of this three-year degree have developed an understanding of atua Māori, karakia, pūrākau and their relevance to the weaving art form. They have produced a kohinga toi whaiaro to record their weaving journey, learnt traditional techniques in dyeing and staining and produced taonga for their whānau. As they continue to increase their proficiency and mātauranga through the creation of more refined woven art forms they will also be able to mount and curate an exhibition of works.

Advanced language studies, technology skills and advanced iwi and hapū studies have further reinforced the specialist studies of this tāhuhu programme.

Reinterpretations of tikanga that have flowed from interaction between tikanga Māori and Pākehā law were examined and deconstructed and graduates enquired into the potential for tikanga to underpin contemporary developments and strategies.

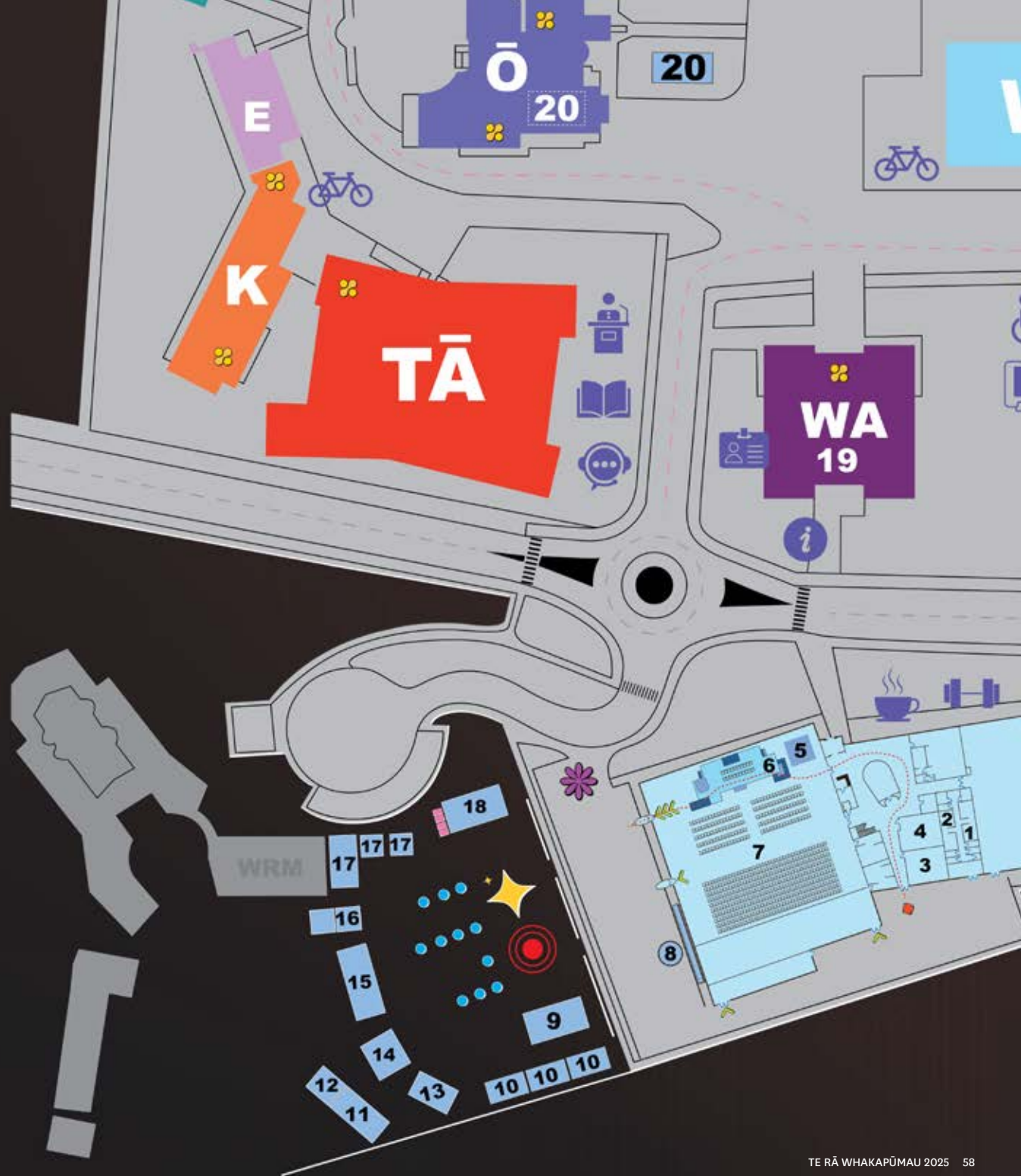
