- Mūrau for Reo opens on the first day of academic year. Students are expected to start their online reo lessons in the first week. From there on in students are expected to engage in their reo studies each week until completion of all online work including tuhinga.
 - The 12 weeks allocated to online work will follow the dates of the first 12 weeks of each huringa, students who are enrolled late are expected to catch up to the appropriate week of where the online programme is at eg: if a student is enrolled at week 3 of the academic year, please communicate to the student that they are expected to put in the appropriate hours of work to catch up to week 3, the online lessons are set so that students can do this.
 - The 12 weeks of online work and the tuhinga are to be completed prior to attending Hui Rumaki. The new layout is 10weeks online lessons and then 2weeks to complete tuhinga prior to attending hui rumaki.
 - Pānui regarding online work and any updates are posted on their reo Mūrau or will go out weekly and fortnightly through mūrau messenger. As students are expected to be engaged in their reo studies every week, they are encouraged to check their mūrau2 mailboxes or notice boards at least twice a week to catch the weekly pānui. Hui Rumaki Reo
 - Hui Rumaki – Full Attendance is the first requirement to completing a hui rumaki. Full attendance begins at the pōwhiri and ends with the final karakia on the last day. Please advise students to make the appropriate arrangements re: childcare and travel so that they can fully attend their assigned hui rumaki. As it stands all hui rumaki will be face to face. RPL – Reo Accreditation (Tuhinga & Kōrero ā waha)
 - All tono for RPL should come through Te Tomonga, once RPL has been requested via enrolment, they will email them the appropriate requirement info to gain RPL and once the required paperwork comes in – the appointment is then assigned to the appropriate pūkenga to complete. For some tohu such as Te Rangakura & Toiora Whānau we will discuss the RPL arrangements with students regarding the allocation of reo papers for the duration of their degree and to also meet any teaching scholarship requirements such as being a fulltime student.
- Closing date for all RPL tono is the 30th of March 2026**
- Pūkenga are readily available through mūrau, email and teams. Any pātai pertaining to their online mahi, mūrau should be their first port of call, any other queries may come through emails or MS teams. Next year we will have a central email for all coms between taura and pūkenga reo.
 - Any pātai or tono from students pertaining to any part of their Reo studies please direct to the appropriate pūkenga or Pūkenga Matua.
