



I've been thinking a lot about the early days of the mission. Those were exciting times full of miracles every day! But they were also very hard days. Jamie and I were constantly praying for help to pay the next bill. We did it because we had faith in our calling and we knew that the work in Micronesia was essential to **Changing Hearts and Lives.** 

In those days, we sailed our doctors out to tiny outer islands where medical and dental care was scarce and the island staff was in desperate need of basic medicine and supplies. One of the greatest joys of my life was watching our volunteers provide training that would make an impact long after we set sail and headed out of the lagoon.

Canvasback's efforts helped to build a legacy that led to the development of an outer-island dispensary system. Then, we shifted our sights to our current model of bringing specialty care to the larger island hospitals and empowering the people of the Marshall Islands with the tools to reverse the epidemic of diabetes.

All the while, we kept our emphasis on **Building Capacity: giving local health providers the skills and means to treat their patients.** Canvasback is helping to sponsor Tzun Rafael, a local Palauan doctor, to attend the Pacific Island Orthopedic Association Orthopedic Masters Training Program. He will be the first Palauan Orthopedic surgeon and be able to provide a service to the people of Palau.

On our recent trip to Palau, I had the privilege of watching my long-time friend Dr. Nathan Kam train the local doctor on high-tech gastroenterology procedures that are providing Dr. Myra the skills to treat patients without the help of our Super Teams.

**Building Capacity** also means providing supplies and services that are unavailable to the islanders. Palau now has a full fracture set for the treatment of their patients. In Majuro, Canvasback provided an Ophthalmologist to perform unavailable corneal transplant surgery. And thanks to Canvasback, patients now have the means of acquiring custom made single-vision eyeglasses at a mere fraction of what they normally cost!

The gratitude expressed by patients and their families is palpable, and it reinforces the importance of our mission. We believe that healthcare should be accessible to all, and it has become very evident that Canvasback's efforts—with your supportare **Changing Hearts and Lives.**

## A HEALTHY IDEA AT THE WELLNESS CENTER

The Canvasback Wellness Center on Majuro is famous for its affordable, nutritious meals and fun health classes! With our directors, Lauren and Rick Wiegel, we're offering classes four nights a week for prediabetes and chronic disease management.

We've also begun a new project specifically focused on tackling the rising obesity rates among Children. In collaboration with the Ministries of Education and Health and supported by a grant from the World Diabetes Foundation (WDF), over the next three years, we're establishing and revitalizing 51 school and community gardens while implementing a new Physical Education curriculum nationwide!

This comprehensive approach not only addresses immediate health concerns but also fosters long-term community resilience, ensuring a healthier future for the next generation in the Marshall Islands!



## TOMORROW'S HEALERS

In August, Belau National Hospital welcomed a dedicated specialty **gastroenterology Super Team** to elevate local healthcare capabilities. This mission focused on providing advanced training for Dr. Myra Adelbai-Fraser and the OR staff, ensuring they can deliver top-notch gastroenterology services to their community.

Under the expert guidance of Drs. Nathan Kam and Ju-En Thlick, the team performed **68 procedures, including 36 upper endoscopies and 32 colonoscopies, directly benefiting 53 patients.** Alongside them, Dr. Raymond Yip enhanced anesthesia and pain management, while our support staff, including Nimfa Wroblewski, Victoria Wroblewski, Ivonnie Paul, and Sara Harkness, provided essential support in the operating room and recovery areas.

In addition to hands-on training, the team improved the hospital's new "Tamanu" Electronic Medical Records system, streamlining processes for GI procedure documentation and pathology requisitions. These enhancements will ensure greater efficiency and accuracy in patient care!

We also donated **over \$25,624 worth of specialty equipment,** including a refurbished gastroscope.

Our volunteers' expertise improved workflow, benefiting both the medical team and patient safety. These changes allowed for easier access to anesthesia equipment and streamlined procedures, reinforcing the importance of ergonomics in surgical environments.




## **OPHTHALMOLOGY**

In January our ophthalmology team led by Dr. David Gano, Dr. Jeffrey Ing, and Dr. Paul Chung, provided vital eye examinations and performed 194 surgeries, including cataract surgeries and two corneal transplants—the first of their kind in the region!

In total, the team conducted 405 ophthalmic consultations, 592 autorefractions, and 244 A-scans, alongside distributing 345 pairs of reading glasses, 84 prescription glasses, and 580 sunglasses. Additionally, 67 patients will received custom-made single vision glasses, provided at no cost.

The mission not only gave access to eye care but also **contributed \$718,226.24** in donated services and equipment. This initiative marks a significant step forward in advancing vision care in the Marshall Islands, benefitting countless patients in the community.



## MAJURO MEDICAL OUTREACH

With collaboration and commitment to improving healthcare, the RMI Ministry of Health partnered with Canvasback Missions for two impactful missions in 2024. The ophthalmology Super Team provided essential eye care services, including surgeries and assessments, significantly enhancing access to eye health in the Marshall Islands. Following closely, our gynecology team focused on women's health, offering examinations, surgeries, and vital screenings that saved lives!





## **WOMEN'S HEALTH**

Led by Dr. Anne Anholm, our team conducted **344 clinic visits and completed 328 procedures, including 37 surgeries** such as total abdominal

hysterectomies and mastectomies.

Vital screenings resulted in early interventions, with many procedures prompted by pap smear diagnoses, potentially saving lives. The team also interpreted **256 PAP cases and performed 126 ultrasound scans**, all while ensuring quality patient care through a dedicated support staff.

The mission contributed **\$487,697** in services and donated supplies. We know that our care for the women in Majuro impacts everyone and provides the foundation of a strong future!
