

PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION



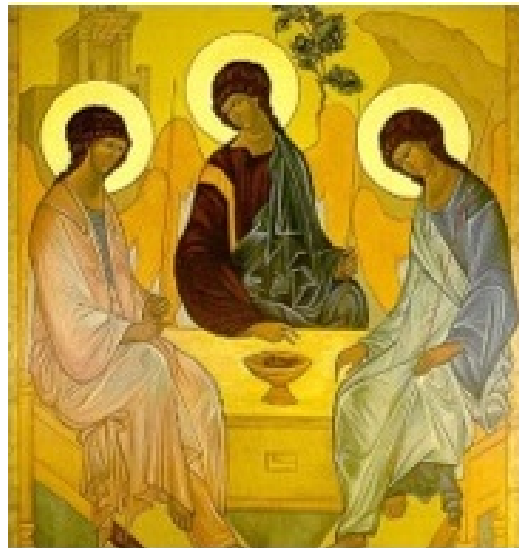
