And our hearts con - fess Him King of glo - ry now.

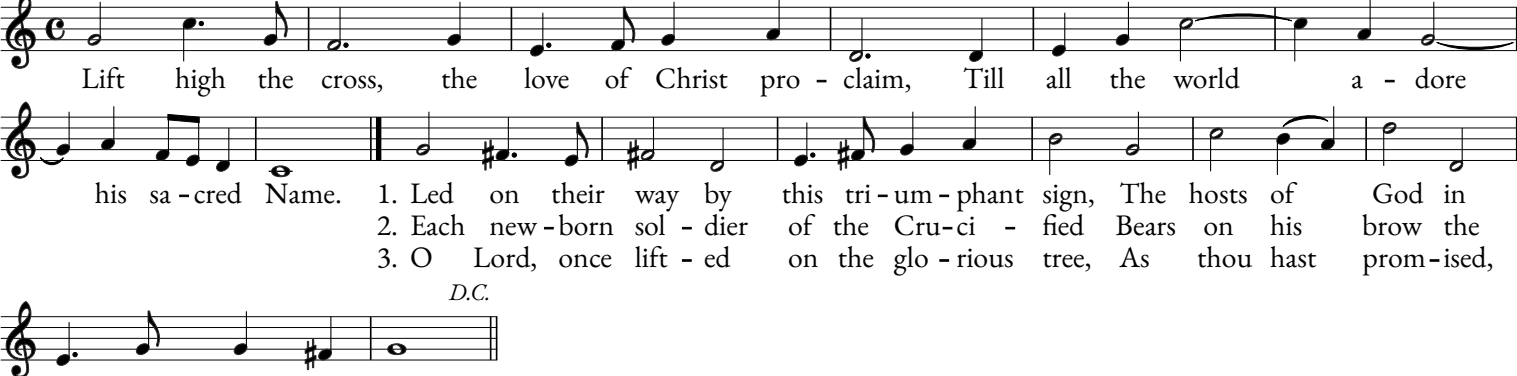
PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION

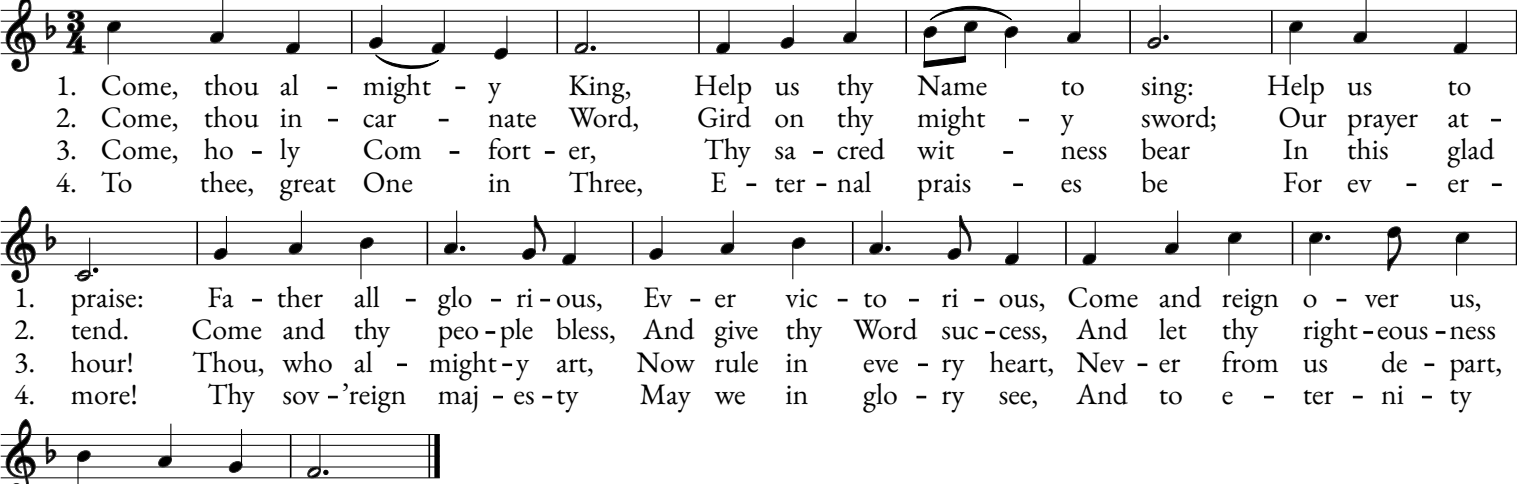
