Who is this guide for?

You have one day in Mykonos, perhaps 6-hours or more before you need to be back on board. That is more than enough time to fall in love with this island, if you know exactly where to go and whom to trust.

This guide was written by the team at YourConcierge.gr — locals who live and breathe Mykonos. We have put together everything you need to make your shore day effortless, authentic, and completely unforgettable.

! Missing the ship

Every tour we run comes with a guaranteed on-time return. We know every port schedule, every shuttle, every shortcut. You will never miss your ship with us.

! Feeling like a tourist in a herd

We run private and small-group tours only. No 50-person buses, no flag-waving guide. Just you, a local guide, and the island.

! Tourist traps and overpriced stops

We take you where locals actually eat and shop. Our restaurant partners are chosen for quality, not commission. We tell you the price before you go in.

! Not enough time to see the real Mykonos

With 5–6 hours, you can see more than most tourists see in 3 days — if you have the right guide. Our itineraries are designed around your ship's schedule.

! Mobility and comfort concerns

All vehicles are clean, air-conditioned private vans and minibuses. Every stop is chosen with comfort in mind. Cold water is always on board. We go at your pace.



THE CRUISE REALITY CHECK

The Truth About Your visiting hours

Your Ship Arrives: 7:00 AM or 8:00 AM (usually)
All Aboard: 4:00 PM or 5:00 PM (non-negotiable)
Actual exploration time: ~5.5 hours after disembarkation



The #1 fear we hear: "What if we miss the ship?"

Our answer: With proper planning, you won't.

With ***our*** planning, you physically can't—we've never missed a ship, and we stake our reputation on it.

THE 3 MISTAKES THAT RUIN CRUISE DAYS

✗ MISTAKE #1: "We'll Just Wing It."

The scenario: You stroll off the shuttle, follow the crowd through Mykonos Town's maze-like streets, spend 45 minutes lost looking for the windmills, grab an overpriced gyro at the first tourist spot, realize you've burned 3 hours, and panic-book a taxi to "see a beach"—any beach.

The result: Sunburn, stress, and stories about "that time we got lost in Greece."

The fix: A structured itinerary with buffer time built in. (See our sample timeline on page 5.)

✗ MISTAKE #2: Booking the Cruise Line's "Convenient" Excursion

The reality: You're herded onto a bus with 50 strangers, shuttled to 3 "approved" vendors who paid for placement, given a few minutes at each stop for photos and shopping, and fed a mediocre meal at a restaurant that exists solely for tour groups.

The cost: \$150-\$200 per person. For that, you get zero flexibility and a sunburn from the bus window.

The fix: A private or small-group tour designed around ***your*** interests, with a local who adjusts on the fly. Same price range. Worlds apart in experience.

✗ MISTAKE #3: Ignoring the "Return to Ship" Buffer

The nightmare: You find the perfect seaside taverna. The wine flows. The sunset mesmerizes. You lose track of time. The last shuttle left 20 minutes ago. You're now calculating helicopter costs (€3,000+) or praying the ship waits (it won't—cruise lines leave passengers behind regularly).

The fix: Our tours include a 45-minute "panic buffer" before all-aboard time, real-time traffic monitoring, and a driver who knows every shortcut on this island.

We've never missed a ship. We never will.

The perfect Mykonos day, a general plan — in 5 hours

YOUR ITINERARY

This is the route we have perfected over years of guiding cruise visitors.

The schedule below is just a reference to our tours. Check our website for the full list of the tours, with the exact timings.



9:00 AM	<p>Meet at the port Your guide meets you dockside with personalised day plan. Private vehicle waiting — no queues, no waiting.</p>
9:15 AM	<p>Mykonos Town (Chora) — the heart of the island The white washed alleys, the colourful doors, the cats on the steps. We show you the back streets that no tour bus can reach. Photo stop at the iconic Windmills of Kato Mili with no crowds.</p>
10:15 AM	<p>Little Venice & Paraportiani Church The most photographed church in the Cyclades. Stand-alone time for photos, then a walk along the waterfront of Little Venice — the view that makes everyone stop talking.</p>
11:00 AM	<p>Coffee & local pastries We stop at a bakery with no tourist menu. Try a melopita (honey cheese pie) and a proper Greek coffee. This is the stop our guests always talk about when they get home.</p>
11:30 AM	<p>Ano Mera village — the secret Mykonos The one and only village in Mykonos, cruise visitors ever reach Ano Mera. A real Greek village, the 16th-century Tourliani Monastery, and the one of the best bakery on the island.</p>
12:30 PM	<p>Sit-down lunch at a local taverna Fresh-caught fish, Mykonian salad, local wine. We book the table in advance. No waiting, no tourist menu. You eat where the fishermen eat.</p>
2:00 PM	<p>Scenic drive & beach stop (optional) Depending on your ship's schedule, a 20-minute stop at Ornos or Agios Stefanos beach — clear Aegean water, a sun lounger, the moment everyone needs.</p>
3:00 PM	<p>Back to the port — guaranteed We return you to the port with time to spare. Your driver will drop you off right at the cruise ship gate for easy access to your ship.</p>

Beyond the Postcard: What Locals Know



The Windmill Photo Without the Tour Bus

There's a spot 200 meters past the main viewpoint. No railing, no crowds, better light for photos. We take you there.

Ano Mera: The Real Mykonos

While cruise groups cluster in town, we drive 15 minutes to a village where grandfathers start their day with a glass of Tsipouro at the taverna and talk about the gossip of the day!

The Beach That's "Closed"

One of our favorites is technically "closed" to large groups. Small private tours? Welcome. Crystal water, no sunbed fees, total peace.

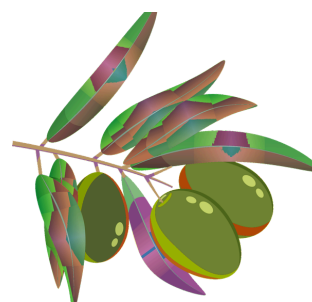
Skip the Port-Side Traps. Do This Instead

Coffee: *Mikri Venetia* in Little Venice, open early, locals' secret, perfect bougatsa

Lunch: *Kiki's Tavern* (no reservations, we know the workaround) or *Fokos* Taverna at Fokos Beach—no menu, just what they caught that morning

Sweet: *Melopita* (honey pie) from a bakery in Ano Mera—recipe unchanged since 1950

Wine: A glass of *Assyrtiko* from Santorini at a cliffside spot we'll show you



INSIDER KNOWLEDGE - PRACTICAL INFORMATION

Everything you need before you arrive

1 The Port matters

Mykonos has two ports — the Old Port in town and the New Port (Tourlos) 2km away. Most cruise ships dock at the New Port. **Always confirm your docking location with your ship and share it with us when booking.**

Taxis are scarce.

The sea bus runs every 20 minutes (€2,5 per person per ride).

2 Peak hours to avoid

Mykonos Town gets extremely crowded between 10 AM and 2 PM in July and August. We plan our itineraries to hit the best spots early, before the main crowds arrive from other ships.

3 The Meltemi wind

The dry - etesian- (meltemi) blows in summer. It keeps the island cool but can make some beaches choppy. We always have a sheltered alternative ready.

4 Cash vs card

Most restaurants and shops accept cards (Visa/Mastercard). But always carry €20–30 in cash for small bakeries, the market, and tips. ATMs in town charge high fees, better to use the EuroBank ATM at the old Port across the Yaught Club inside the Old Port pier. Its were the tender boats leave you. Currency: Euro (€).

5 What to wear

Comfortable walking shoes are essential — Mykonos Town has cobble stones that are beautiful but uneven. Light layers in spring and autumn; sunscreen and a hat are non-negotiable in summer.

6 Water

Tap water in Mykonos is not considered drinkable due to high mineral content; bottled water is recommended.

7 The real local food to try

Kopanisti (spicy cheese), louza (cured pork), and freshly grilled octopus. Ask for the daily fish — if it is not on the menu, they will tell you what came in that morning.

8 Connectivity

EU roaming applies for European visitors. US visitors: your international plan usually covers Greece. Free Wi-Fi is available at most cafes — ask for the password. We recommend downloading Google Maps offline for Mykonos before departure.

8 Safety

The main danger is the heat in July and August. Drink water constantly and wear sunscreen. Mykonos is extremely safe for tourists. Petty theft can occur in crowded areas — keep bags in front of you.

9 Medical

Mykonos has a public health centre (Kentro Ygeias) and a private clinic near the town centre. For minor issues, every pharmacy speaks English. Your ship's medical centre handles emergencies.

TOP SPOTS

The places worth your time

Not every famous spot deserves your limited hours. Here is our honest assessment of what is worth it, what to skip, and what you can only find with a local.

Must visit **Mykonos Town (Chora)**

~2M visitors./year



The heart of the island. Whitewashed alleys, bougainvillea, boutiques, and cafes. Beautiful at any hour but magical before 10 AM.

Must visit **Little Venice**

~1.8M visitors/year



Waterfront houses built directly over the sea. The best sunset spot on the island, but equally beautiful in the morning light.

Must visit **Windmills of Kato Mili**

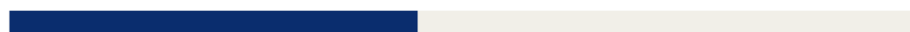
~1.7M visitors/year



The symbol of Mykonos. Five minutes from Chora. Best photos: arrive before 10 AM to avoid the crowds.

Worth it **Paraportiani Church**

~900K visitors/year



The most photographed church in the Cyclades. Small, quiet, and genuinely beautiful. Allow 15 minutes.

Hidden gem **Ano Mera village**

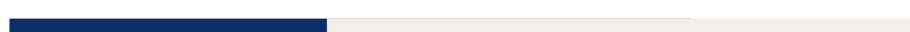
~10% of cruise visitors



Most tourists never come here. A real Greek village with a magnificent monastery and the best honey doughnuts on the island.

Consider carefully **Paradise & Super Paradise Beach**

~1.5M visitors/year



Famous, beautiful, and packed. The beach clubs are loud and expensive. We recommend Ornos or Agios Stefanos for a quieter, more authentic swim.





FOOD & DRINK

What to eat, what to order, where to go

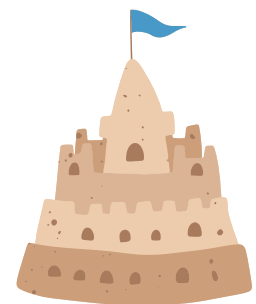
Mykonos has excellent food if you know where to look. The tourist menus near the windmills are expensive and mediocre. Ten minutes from there, you can eat like a local for the same price.

MUST-TRY DISHES

- ✓ Kopanisti — Spicy, creamy Mykonian cheese — served with bread as a meze.
- ✓ Louza — Air-cured pork fillet, sliced thin. A Mykonian speciality for centuries.
- ✓ Melopita — Honey and cheese pie — light, not too sweet. Best from a bakery.
- ✓ Fresh octopus — Grilled on charcoal, drizzled with olive oil and lemon. Order it.
- ✓ Loukoumades — Hot honey doughnuts, crispy outside, fluffy inside.
- ✓ Local wine (Assyrtiko) — From the Cyclades — crisp, mineral, perfect with fish.

WHAT TO ORDER — AND WHAT TO AVOID

Order this	Skip this
Fresh daily fish (ask what came in today)	Any menu with photos on it
Greek salad with local feta	Pizza and pasta near the windmills
The mezedes sharing plate	'International' or 'fusion' restaurants
House wine by the carafe	Anything with a price sign outside in €€€
Morning coffee at a local kafeneion	The Starbucks at the airport

New Port: No—shuttle or taxi required. We'll pick you up either way.

New Port to the Old Port: It's quite risky, as there are no sidewalks.

Should we just do the cruise line's excursion?

Only if you value convenience over experience. Their groups are 40+.

Ours are 2-18. Their schedule is rigid. Ours adapts to you. Same price point, different planets.

Can we really see 'everything' in a few hours?
