CERTIFICATE

**Whereas** Jesse Haven, Probate Judge of Morgan County Utah Territory, in trust for the several use and benefit of the occupants of the Town Site of Croxden, in said County and Territory, according to their respective interests by virtue of the act of March 2<sup>nd</sup> 1867, entitled "An Act for the relief of the inhabitants of Cities and Towns upon the public lands," has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Salt Lake City, Utah Territory, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Jesse Haven, Probate Judge as aforesaid in trust as aforesaid

according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the North East quarter, the North West quarter of the South East quarter, the South East quarter of the North West quarter and the North half of the South West quarter of section twenty, in Township four North, of Range four East, in the district of lands subject to sale at Salt Lake City, Utah Territory, containing three hundred and twenty acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said Tract has been purchased by the said Jesse Haven Probate Judge as aforesaid in trust as aforesaid

Now know ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Jesse Haven, Probate Judge as aforesaid in trust as aforesaid

and to his successors, the said Tract above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, therunto belonging, unto the said

Jesse Haven Probate Judge as aforesaid in trust as aforesaid

and to his successors ~~to~~ and assigns, <sup>in trust as aforesaid</sup>; ~~subject to any~~  
~~dated and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law.~~  
~~No title shall be hereby acquired to any mine of Gold, Silver, cinnabar or Copper or to any valid Mining claim or possession held under existing laws of Congress.~~

In testimony whereof, I, Ulysses S. Grant, President of the

United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
