

Having Your Child Baptized at St. Anthony of Padua Parish

A note from Friar John, Pastor.

I am happy you have chosen to have your child baptized in the Roman Catholic Church and here at St. Anthony of Padua Parish. Please fill-out a Baptismal Registration Form and bring it to me after Mass the next time you come to church. At that time, we can:

- 1) Review the registration form to ensure that the requirements listed below are met, and
- 2) Schedule the date and time of the baptism, if you know when that might be. See item B below.

After this registration form is completed but prior to the baptism, if this is your first child to be Baptized, you conclude your preparation by participating in a Baptism Preparation Class held at 6:00 - 7:00 pm in the **social hall parlor** on one of these Tuesdays:

in 2026: (a) Tues Jan 6, (b) Tues April 7 (c) Tues July 7 (d) Tues Oct 6. Classes are still 6:00PM - 7:00PM in the Parlor.

Baptism Requirements of the Roman Catholic Church

- A. There is to be a well-founded hope that the infant will be brought up in the Catholic religion; if such hope is lacking, the baptism is to be put off. At least one parent, or the person who lawfully takes their place, must give consent. (cc. 868)
- B. Baptisms are usually celebrated on a Sunday (cc. 856), in the church (cc. 857), and at St. Anthony typically take place after the 11 am Mass, at about 12:00 noon.
- C. A Godparent, also known as a sponsor, must:
 - 1. Be at least 16 years of age and have the qualifications and intention of fulfilling this role.
 - 2. Be a Catholic who has received the sacrament of Confirmation and has already received the Most Holy Eucharist and leads a life in harmony with the faith and the roll to be undertaken. Please read the sponsor certificate carefully to understand this.
 - 3. Provide a letter of good standing from his or her home parish (if not St. Anthony) or use the provided sponsor certificate and have it signed by his or her pastor.
 - 4. Not be the father or mother of the one to be baptized. (cc. 874)
- D. There is to be only one male sponsor and one female sponsor (cc. 873)
- E. A baptized Christian who belongs to a non-Catholic church community may not serve as a Catholic Godparent but may be a "Christian witness" to the baptism along with a Catholic Sponsor meeting the above requirements. (cc. 874 s2) One never baptized, cannot be a godparent of a Catholic Child. These guidelines come from the Code of Canon Law (cc.) of the Roman Catholic Church.
