

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

As Catholics we understand that none of our actions are truly isolated. Every virtue we practice or sin we commit affects others because we are all members of the body of Christ. Today's readings from the Old and New Testaments highlight our interconnectedness and offer guidance for how to order the life of the community according to God's will. The key to tranguil communal life is to consider the needs of others as important as our own. In the first reading, the prophet Amos decries those who exploit the poor for personal gain, putting profit over the common good. In the second reading, St. Paul begs the community to pray not only for themselves and for their close relatives, but to offer prayer and supplication for everyone. It's tempting to buy into the perspective that we need only focus on our own life. But the Lord invites us into authentic community where we intercede, sacrifice for and build up the kingdom together.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

I like to think of myself as a trustworthy person, and I'd expect most of us would consider ourselves the same. But as the Lord convicts my heart with today's Gospel reading about those who are trustworthy or untrustworthy in big and small matters, I hear the Holy Spirit inviting me to ponder deeper questions: Perhaps I don't intentionally deceive people and I aim to keep my word, but when someone's name or reputation comes up in conversation, can I be trusted to build them up? Do I fall prey to petty gossip, or simply sit idly by as others fall? I am true to scheduled commitments I make, but am I trustworthy with how I spend all my time? Do I use the gift of time for God's greater glory, or do I squander it with excessive scrolling or mindless TV shows? The Spirit doesn't want us to be scrupulous, and everything must be understood through God's merciful gaze. But the Lord does intend to purify us so that we can live more fully in communion with him.

REFLECT

Today, consider how you are invited to live in community and contribute to the building of a Christ-like culture. How are you called to more trustworthy stewardship of the gifts and time God has given you so that you can use them for building up the body of Christ?



A NOTE FROM THE ASSOCIATE PASTOR...

Dear friends,

Through the parable of the unfaithful steward, who was caught in mismanaging his master's property, Jesus teaches an important lesson to his followers and the would-be disciples: no one can serve God and mammon, Good and evil, Light and darkness, at the same time. Either we serve God and His kingdom or serve the evil one and his kingdom. Serving mammon is a violation of the first commandment: 'I am the lord your God, you shall have no other gods before me'. Excessive desire for wealth or greed is a form of idolatry which is contrary to God's desire for man. God comes first in our lives, everything else is secondary.

The dishonest servant, faced with losing his job, quickly reduced or cancelled out the debts of his master's debtors. However, the master praised the dishonest servant for his shrewdness. This parable teaches us the importance of cleverness and determination in dealing with the things of God as the worldly-minded do with regards to things of this world. As the steward acted quickly to secure his future, so must we be, in order, to secure our life with God. Our earthly life is temporary and one day, whether we like it or not, will stand before the Lord and we will be held accountable for our actions and omissions. So why do we not act with more urgency about matters of eternal life than the things of this world?

Money is necessary but cannot buy eternal life. It is only a 'means' not 'the end.' If it is used to do good things motivated by love of God and neighbor, then there is eternal reward. At the end of our lives' journey, what will remain is not our earthly savings, but the good deeds performed out of sincere love. St. John of the Cross says: 'At the twilight of our life, we shall be judged on our love alone.'

The parable also reminds us about the importance of faithfulness in small things. If we are trustworthy in small matters, we will be trustworthy in greater things. Every act of honesty, every fair dealing, and every sacrifice for the good of others will be rewarded in eternity. This world is not our eternal home; we are travelers here on earth, our eternal home is in heaven. As wise stewards we are to grow rich in what matters to our salvation.

Let us pray for grace to always be faithful and keep our minds focused on the things of heaven. God bless you!



SAINTS OF THE WEEK:

September 23

The Franciscan Saint Padre Pio

"Kneel down and render the tribute of your presence and devotion to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Confide all your needs to him, along with those of others. Speak to him with filial abandonment, give free rein to your heart, and give him complete freedom to work in you as he thinks best." (Padre Pio)

Padre Pio, a Capuchin friar of peasant background, spent virtually his entire life in a monastery in southern Italy. In most respects he was indistinguishable from his fellow friars. But for some mysterious purpose, Padre Pio was set apart. For the thousands of pilgrims who flocked to hear him say Mass, or to have him hear their confessions, or simply to rest their gaze on his bandaged hands, he was living proof for the existence of God. Like his spiritual father St. Francis, Padre Pio was a stigmatic; he bore on his hands, feet, and side the wounds of Christ.

September 27 St. Vincent De Paul Patron: of charities; horses; hospitals; leprosy; lost articles; Madagascar; prisoners; Richmond, Virginia; spiritual



help; Saint Vincent de Paul Societies; Sacred Heart Cathedral Preparatory; Vincentian Service Corps; volunteers

Birth: 1581 / Death: 1660 / Beatified: August 13, 1729, Rome, Papal States by Pope Benedict XIII; Canonized: June 16, 1737, Rome, Papal States by Pope Clement XII He was eighty years old when he died in Paris on September 27, 1660. He had "become the symbol of the successful reform of the French Church". St. Vincent is sometimes referred to as "The Apostle of Charity" and "The Father of the Poor.

BABY BOTTLE COLLECTION for THE WOMEN'S CENTERS OF GREATER CHICAGOLAND

Beginning October 4, 2025, our church will be participating in The Baby Bottle Project benefiting The Women's Centers of Greater Chicagoland. This non-profit

organization directly assists mothers and families experiencing crisis pregnancies by offering emotional, financial, material, and spiritual support through counseling, clothing & monetary provisions, prayer, and other aid. Each year the three locations together have over 3,500 appointments with expecting mothers. By God's Grace, The Women's Centers have saved over 41,000 babies—and their mothers—from abortion since opening in 1984.



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Recently, Pope Leo spoke to seminarians who had gathered from all around the world for the Jubilee. He invited them to be witnesses of hope. Indeed, the men who are preparing for ordination in the Archdiocese of Chicago are witnesses of hope to us. In the future, they will serve our children, grandchildren and great grandchildren.

Some of our seminarians are in the pre-seminary spiritual year at Bishop Quarter House in the city. Others are completing their college studies at the University of St. Thomas in Saint Paul, Minnesota. Finally, those in the last four-year phase of preparation are being formed at Mundelein Seminary.

Supporting vocations to the priesthood is a task that belongs to all of us in the Church. I want to invite you to express that support in four ways:

Drodzy przyjaciele,

Poprzez przypowieść o niewiernym zarządcy, przyłapanym na niewłaściwym zarządzaniu majątkiem swego pana, Jezus udziela ważnej lekcji swoim naśladowcom i przyszłym uczniom: nikt nie może służyć Bogu i mamonie, Dobru i złu, Światłu i ciemności jednocześnie. Albo służymy Bogu i Jego Królestwu, albo Złemu i Jego Królestwu. Służenie mamonie jest pogwałceniem pierwszego przykazania: "Ja jestem Pan, Bóg twój, nie będziesz miał innych bogów przede mną". Nadmierne pragnienie bogactwa lub chciwość to forma bałwochwalstwa, sprzeczna z pragnieniem Boga wobec człowieka. Bóg jest na pierwszym miejscu w naszym życiu, wszystko inne jest drugorzędne.

Nieuczciwy sługa, w obliczu utraty pracy, szybko zmniejszył lub umorzył długi dłużników swego pana. Pan jednak pochwalił nieuczciwego sługę za jego roztropność. Ta przypowieść uczy nas, jak ważna jest bystrość i determinacja w postępowaniu z rzeczami Bożymi, tak jak ludzie o świeckim usposobieniu postępują w sprawach tego świata. Jak zarządca działał szybko, aby zabezpieczyć swoją przyszłość, tak i my musimy działać szybko, aby zapewnić sobie życie z Bogiem. Nasze ziemskie życie jest tymczasowe i pewnego dnia, czy nam się to podoba, czy nie, staniemy przed Panem i będziemy rozliczani z naszych czynów i zaniedbań. Dlaczego więc nie działamy pilniej w sprawach życia wiecznego niż w sprawach tego świata?

Pieniądze są niezbędne, ale nie można kupić życia wiecznego. Są tylko "środkiem", a nie "celem". Jeśli zostaną wykorzystane do czynienia dobra motywowanego miłością do Boga i bliźniego, czeka nas wieczna nagroda. Na końcu naszej życiowej drogi nie pozostaną nasze ziemskie oszczędności, ale dobre uczynki spełnione ze szczerej miłości. Święty Jan od Krzyża mówi: "U schyłku naszego życia będziemy sądzeni tylko z naszej miłości". Przypowieść przypomina nam również o znaczeniu wierności w małych rzeczach. Jeśli będziemy godni zaufania w małych sprawach, będziemy godni zaufania w większych. Każdy akt uczciwości, każde uczciwe postępowanie i każde poświęcenie dla dobra innych zostanie nagrodzone w wieczności. Ten świat nie jest naszym wiecznym domem; jesteśmy wędrowcami tutaj na ziemi, nasz wieczny dom jest w niebie. Jako mądrzy szafarze mamy bogacić się w to, co ważne dla naszego zbawienia.


