

USEFUL INFORMATION

REQUIRED CHURCH DOCUMENTS

- You will need to obtain a new copy of your Baptismal Certificate, dated within six months of the wedding date. Call the church where you were baptized and ask for this, and
- A Confirmation Certificate from the church where you were confirmed unless this is noted on the back of the Baptismal Certificate.
- A Questionnaire which is filled out by both parties at the rectory with a priest, or deacon.
- Two affidavits are usually required. These are statements that are filled out by two people who have known you well from at least the age of fifteen.
 Your parents are the usual witnesses, if possible. These affidavits testify that you are free to marry. They are generally filled out at the parish closest to where the witnesses reside.
- Annulment/divorce decrees, if applicable.



CIVIL DOCUMENTS

The state of Illinois and the county of Cook require a marriage license ob-tained from the COOK COUNTY CLERK. The marriage license must be obtained at least one day, and not more than sixty (60) days, before the wedding. You may obtain the marriage license at any of the following locations:

Hours: Monday - Friday 8:30 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. You will need: proof of age - proper I.D.

PRE-CANA

The Archdiocese of Chicago requires all couples to participate in a formal process of marriage preparation. This is generally accomplished through the Pre-Cana programs. You should complete your Pre-Cana class well in advance of your wedding.

SCHEDULING THE WEDDING

When deciding on your marriage date, be mindful that, with so many Masses celebrated each weekend, we cannot accommodate Sunday weddings. Further, because of the penitential nature of Lent, and longstanding tradition, weddings are not celebrated at St. John Brebeuf Parish during this season.

Weddings are held in our church on Saturdays. If you wish to schedule your wedding on any other day, generally Fridays, arrangements are to be made with the priest or deacon who has been assigned to you.

Each wedding is allowed a total of two hours: ½ hour before the wedding for pictures and the seating of guests, one hour for the wedding itself, and ½ hour afterwards for pictures and greeting guests. Be aware that any tardiness will cut into your picture time.



PHOTOGRAPHS/VIDEOTAPE

Pictures and videotaping are allowed during the ceremony and for a specified time after the ceremony, however, the photographer and videographer must abide by the priest or deacon's established rules, work in a non-obstructive manner and respect the sanctity of the sacraments being celebrated. Extra lighting for video cameras and flashes are NOT allowed because it is extremely distracting. It is your responsibility to advise your photographer and videographer of the parish policy. Your photographer and/or videographer need to consult with the priest or deacon prior to the beginning of the wedding ceremony to identify them and find out where the placement of equipment is allowed.

BANNS

The public announcement of your wedding will be printed in the Sunday bulletin for three consecutive weeks prior to the wedding.

FLOWERS

The church provides the flowers and their cost it is included in the wedding fee. Any additional arrangements must be consulted with the church.

RICE/FLOWERS THROWING

The throwing of rice and/or any other objects is not allowed inside or outside the Church. Rice, confetti, birdseed, etc. underfoot are hazardous. For the safety of all those using the facilities after you, please advise your guests of this request. Bubbles are the least problematic to the environment and may be used outside on the sidewalk.

MAINTENANCE

We ask that you be responsible for maintaining the cleanliness and orderliness of the premises during your use of the facilities. If your photographer and brings any bags, boxes, or other disposable items please be sure to ask them to dispose of them properly in the receptacles in the vestibule or sacristy.



FEES

We would like to offer gratuitous sacramental celebrations for our parishioners, however, due to rising costs we collect traditional fees for the use of the church (i.e. baptisms, weddings, funerals).

The fee is \$600.00 for registered parishioners who have a personal history of support for this parish. It is due no later than the day of the rehearsal. The fee is a gift to the Church for operating needs. The priest or deacon does not receive a share of this fee. Thus, there is a free will fee for the priest or deacon who will help to prepare you for marriage and who will conduct your wedding. This fee is to be paid on the rehearsal day directly to the priest. The customary gift of \$20 for two altar servers, who assist during the ceremony, is also practiced at our parish. Fees for the organist, soloist and choir are assessed separately.

We accept weddings of non-parishioners or those residing out of the parish boundaries with the permission of the pastor of their parish. The fee for non-parishioners is \$800.



CHURCH ETIQUETTE

Please remember that you are in a sacred place and that proper reverence is called for. No smoking, eating or drinking is allowed either in the church or chapel. This applies to the Bride's Room, the sacristy where the groom may be waiting, as well as the Church and vestibule.

It is uncommon, but it has happened that some members of the wedding party abuse alcohol, tobacco or drugs before the wedding ceremony. The couple themselves is prohibited by church law from abusing alcohol or drugs as that may hinder their free intention to marry. The priest or deacon MUST refuse to proceed with the wedding if there has been evidence of drug or alcohol use. Please choose people for your wedding party with an appropriate level of maturity.



GUIDELINES FOR RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

The following are guidelines set forth by the National Conference of Catholic Bish-ops.

- For Catholics

Catholics fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist when they receive Holy Communion in fulfillment of Christ's command to eat His Body and drink His Blood. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, communicants should not be conscious of grave sin, have fasted for an hour, and seek to live in charity and love with their neighbors. Those conscious of grave sin must first be reconciled with God and the Church through the sacrament of Penance. A frequent reception of the sacrament of Penance is encouraged for all.

- For Other Christians

We welcome to this celebration of the Eucharist those Christians who are not fully united with us. It is a consequence of the sad divisions in Christianity that we cannot extend to them a general invitation to receive Communion. Catholics believe that the Eucharist is an action of the celebrating community signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. Reception of the Eucharist by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray.

CHURCH MARRIAGE CERTIFICATE

This will be given to you by the priest or deacon who witnesses your wedding. The church certificate is usually sufficient for most needs. A copy of the civil marriage license may be obtained from the County Clerk's Office for a fee about two weeks after the wedding date. Check with the clerk at the time of obtaining the license.

READERS

It is customary at our weddings to invite members of the bridal party or family to read one or two of the scripture selections and the general intercessions that have been chosen. It would be helpful if they have done some public reading or are willing to practice. They should be present at the rehearsal. The First Reading is taken form the Old Testament and the Second from the New Testament.Below you will find the examples of readings and general intercessions to choose.



REHEARSAL

At the rehearsal, the marriage license, church fees and altar server gratuity must be given to the priest or deacon or person conducting the rehearsal if you have not already done so. The time for your rehearsal is to be arranged with your priest or deacon. Please be prompt. Your rehearsal and wedding are probably not the only one that day, or the priest has other scheduled obligations, so please do not delay others because you, or members of your bridal party, are late! The time of the rehearsal is about 30 minutes long.

WEDDING MUSIC

The most important goal of liturgical music is to help people pray. Additionally, musical selections should express not only the faith of the couple, but also the common faith of the whole Church regarding the sacrament of Marriage. It is for this reason that most secular music is NOT appropriate during the Mass or ceremony. Music should be scripturally based, simple, and singable so that those assembled may actively participate. The parish organist will help you choose appropriate music that is within general liturgical guidelines and answer any questions you might have in this matter. The parish has highly trained and

experienced instrumentalists and singers available.

OT ONE (Genesis 1:26-28, 31a)

A reading from the Book of Genesis

The servant of Abraham said to Laban: "I bowed down in worship to the Lord, blessing the Lord, the God of my master Abraham, who had led me on the right road to obtain the daughter of my master's kinsman for his son. If, therefore, you have in mind to show true loyalty to my master, let me know; but if not, let me know that, too. I can then proceed accordingly." Laban and his household said in reply: "This thing comes from the Lord; we can say nothing to you either for or against it. Here is Rebekah, ready for you; take her with you, that she may become the wife of your master's son, as the Lord has said." So they called Rebekah and asked her, "Do you wish to go with this man?" She answered, "I do." At this they allowed their sister Rebekah and her nurse to take leave, along with Abraham's servant and his men. Invoking a blessing on Rebekah, they said: "Sister, may you grow into thousands of myriads; And may your descendants gain possession of the gates of their enemies!" Then Rebekah and her maids started out: they mounted their camels and followed the man. so the servant took Rebekah and went on his way. Meanwhile Isaac had gone from Beer-lahai-roi and was living in the region of the Negeb. One day toward evening he went out . . . in the field, and as he looked around, he noticed that camels were approaching. Rebekah, too, was looking about, and when she saw him, she alighted from her camel and asked the servant, "Who is the man out there, walking through the fields toward us?" "That is my master," replied the servant. Then she covered herself with her veil. The servant recounted to Isaac all the things he had done. Then Isaac took Rebekah into his tent; he married her, and thus she became his wife. In his love for her Isaac found solace after the death of his mother Sarah.



A reading from the Book of Tobit

Raphael and Tobiah entered the house of Raguel and greeted him. Raguel

sprang up and kissed Tobiah, shedding tears of joy. But when he heard that Tobit had lost his eyesight, he was grieved and wept aloud. He said to Tobiah: "My child, God bless you! You are the son of a noble and good father. But what a terrible misfortune that such a righteous and charitable man should be afflicted with blindness!" He continued to weep in the arms of his kinsman Tobiah. His wife Edna also wept for Tobit; and even their daughter Sarah began to weep. Afterward, Raguel slaughtered a ram from the floand gave them a cordial reception. When they had bathed and reclined to eat, Tobiah said to Raphael, "Brother Azariah, ask Raguel to let me marry my kinswoman Sarah." Raguel overheard the words; so he said to the boy: "Eat and drink and be merry tonight, for no man is more entitled to marry my daughter Sarah than you, brother. Besides, not even I have the right to give her to anyone but you, because you are my closest relative. But I will explain the situation to you very frankly. I have given her in marriage to seven men, all of whom were kinsmen of ours, and all died on the very night they approached her. But now, son, eat and drink. I am sure the Lord will look after you both." Tobiah answered, "I will eat or drink nothing until you set aside what belongs to me." Raguel said to him: "I will do it. She is yours according to the decree of the Book of Moses. Your marriage to her has been decided in heaven! Take your kinswoman from now on you are her love, and she is your beloved. She is yours today and ever after. And tonight, son, may the Lord of heaven prosper you both. May he grant you mercy and peace." Then Raguel called his daughter Sarah, and she came to him. He took her by the hand and gave her to Tobiah with the words: "Take her according to the law. According to the decree written in the Book of Moses she is your wife. NT ONE (Romans 8:31b-35, 37-39)

A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Romans

Brothers and sisters: If God is for us, who can be against us? He did not spare his own Son but handed him over for us all. how will he not also give us everything else along with him? Who will bring a charge against God's chosen ones? It is God who acquits us. Who will condemn? It is Christ Jesus who died, rather, was raised. who also is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. What will separate us from the love of Christ? A reading from the First Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians

Brothers and sisters: Strive eagerly for the greatest spiritual gifts. But I shall show you a still more excellent way. If I speak in human and angelic tongues but do not have love. I am a resounding gong or a clashing cymbal. And if I have the gift of prophecy and comprehend all mysteries and all knowledge; if I have all faith so as to move mountains. but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away everything I own, and if I hand my body over so that I may boast but do not have love, I gain nothing. Love is patient, love is kind. It is not jealous, is not pompous, it is not inflated, it is not rude. it does not seek its own interests. it is not quick-tempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails.



NT SEVEN (Ephesians 4:1-6)

A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Ephesians

Brothers and sisters:

I, a prisoner for the Lord,

urge you to live in a manner worthy of the call you have

received.

with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another through love, striving to preserve the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace: one Body and one Spirit, as you were also called to the one hope of your call; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.



NT EIGHT (Ephesians 5:2a, 21-33)

A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Ephesians

Brothers and sisters:

Live in love, as Christ loved us and handed himself over for us. Be subordinate to one another out of reverence for Christ. Wives should be subordinate to their husbands as to the Lord. For the husband is head of his wife just as Christ is head of the Church, he himself the savior of the body. As the Church is subordinate to Christ.so wives should be subordinate to their husbands in everything. Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ loved the Church and handed himself over for her to sanctify her, cleansing her by the bath of water with the word, that he might present to himself the Church in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. So also husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. For no one hates his own flesh but rather nourishes and cherishes it. even as Christ does the Church, because we are members of his Body. For this reason a man shall leave his father and his mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. This is a great mystery, but I speak in reference to Christ and the Church. In any case, each one of you should love his wife as himself, and the wife should respect her husband.



NT NINE (short - Ephesians 5:2a, 25-32)

A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Ephesians

Brothers and sisters: Live in love, as Christ loved us and handed himself over for us. Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ loved the Church and handed himself over for her to sanctify her, cleansing her by the bath of water with the word. that he might present to himself the Church in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. So also husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself For no one hates his own flesh but rather nourishes and cherishes it. even as Christ does the Church. because we are members of his Body. For this reason a man shall leave his father and his mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. This is a great mystery, but I speak in reference to Christ and the Church.



NT TEN (Philippians 4:4-9)

A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Philippians

Brothers and sisters: Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice! Your kindness should be known to all. The Lord is near. Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is honorable. whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Keep on doing what you have learned and received and heard and seen in me.

The word of the Lord.

Then the God of peace will be with you.



NT ELEVEN (Colossians 3:12-17)

A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Colossians

Brothers and sisters:

Put on, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience,

bearing with one another and forgiving one another, if one has a grievance against another; as the Lord has forgiven you, so must you also do.

And over all these put on love, that is, the bond of perfection.

NT THIRTEEN (1 Peter 3:1-9)

A reading from the First Letter of Saint Peter

Beloved:

You wives should be subordinate to your husbands so that, even if some disobey the word, they may be won over without a word by their wives' conduct when they observe your reverent and chaste behavior. Your adornment should not be an external one: braiding the hair, wearing gold jewelry, or dressing in fine clothes, but rather the hidden character of the heart. expressed in the imperishable beauty of a gentle and calm disposition, which is precious in the sight of God. For this is also how the holy women who hoped in God once used to adorn themselves and were subordinate to their husbands: thus Sarah obeyed Abraham, calling him "lord." You are her children when you do what is good and fear no intimidation. Likewise, you husbands should live with your wives in understanding, showing honor to the weaker female sex, since we are joint heirs of the gift of life, so that your prayers may not be hindered. Finally, all of you, be of one mind, sympathetic, loving toward one another, compassionate, humble. Do not return evil for evil. or insult for insult:

Do not return evil for evil, or insult for insult; but, on the contrary, a blessing, because to this you were called,

that you might inherit a blessing.



NT FOURTEEN (1 John 3:18-24)

A reading from the First Letter of Saint John

Children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth.

Now this is how we shall know that we belong to the truth and reassure our hearts before him in whatever our hearts condemn, for God is greater than our hearts and knows everything.

Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have confidence in God and receive from him whatever we ask, because we keep his commandments and do what pleases him.

And his commandment is this:
we should believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ,
and love one another just as he commanded us.
Those who keep his commandments remain in him, and he in
them,

and the way we know that he remains in us is from the Spirit that he gave us.



NT FIFTEEN (1 John 4:7-12)

A reading from the First Letter of Saint John

Beloved, let us love one another,
because love is of God;
everyone who loves is begotten by God and knows God.
Whoever is without love does not know God, for God is love.
In this way the love of God was revealed to us:
God sent his only-begotten Son into the world
so that we might have life through him.
In this is love:
