PASTORAL SERVICES APPEAL

Pastor's Corner

Sunday, November 16, 2025

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ!

The theme of today's readings is endurance, or trusting hope, for "The Day of the Lord" or the "Second Coming" of Jesus in glory, as Judge, at the end of the world. They warn us about the final days of the world, our own death, and the final judgment. Malachi, in the first reading, foretells this Day, which will bring healing and reward for the just and punishment in fire for the "proud and all evil doers". Although St. Paul expected that Jesus would return during his lifetime, he cautions the Thessalonians, in the second reading, against idleness in anticipating the end of the world. Paul advises the Thessalonians that the best preparation for welcoming Jesus in his "Second Coming" is to keep working and doing one's duties faithfully, as he did. Today's Gospel passage clarifies that the date of the end of the world is uncertain. Signs and portents will precede the end, and the Christians will be called upon to testify before kings and governors. The Good News is that those who persevere in faithfulness to the Lord will save their souls and enter God's eternal kingdom. Christ's Second Coming is something to celebrate because he is going to present all creation to his Heavenly Father. That is why we say at Mass, "We proclaim Your death, O Lord, and profess Your Resurrection, until You come again." Since Luke's community had experienced much persecution, today's Gospel gives them a cheering reminder: do not give up because God is always with us. Jesus' promise of the protective power of a providing God was meant to encourage His disciples to persevere in Faith and its practice. Jesus later adds the signs of the destruction of Jerusalem and the end of the world, to prepare His disciples and to remind them to rely upon Him for Salvation, not their own power.

We must be prepared daily for our death and private judgment. We make this preparation by trying to do God's will every day, leading holy lives of selfless love, mercy, compassion, and unconditional forgiveness. To do this, we must recharge our spiritual batteries every day by personal prayer, that is, by talking to God, and listening to Him by reading the Bible. Daily examination of our conscience at bedtime, asking God's pardon and forgiveness for the sins of the day, will also prepare us to face God any time and give an account of our lives. We need to attain permanence in a passing world by leading exemplary lives. We must remember that our homes, our Churches and even our own lives are temporary. Our greatness is judged by God, not on our worldly achievements, but on our fidelity to our Faith and its practice in our loving service of others.

Chúa Nhật Ngày 16, tháng 11, 2025

Quý Ông Bà và Anh Chị Em thân mến!

Chủ đề chính của Chúa Nhật 33 Quanh Năm hôm nay là **"Ngày Chúa Đến"** hay là "Đến lần thứ hai" của Chúa Giêsu trong vinh quang, như là vị thẩm phán trong ngày thể mạng của vũ trụ. Những bài đọc cảnh cáo chúng ta về ngày cuối cùng của thế giới, cái chết riêng của chúng ta và việc phán xét chung. Trong bài thứ nhất từ Tiên Tri Malaki nói tiên tri về ngày này, nó sẽ đem lại sự hàn gắn và công thưởng cho người lành và hình phạt lửa cho "những kẻ kiêu căng và những người làm tội ác". Dù Thánh Phaolô tin rằng Chúa Giêsu sẽ trở lại trong cuộc đời của Ngài, Thánh Phaolô cũng cảnh cáo những người Thesalonica những người lười biếng trong khi mong chờ ngày Chúa Giêsu sẽ trở lại. Thánh Phaolô nhắc với họ rằng cách thức để chuẩn bị cho việc Chúa đến lần thứ hai là hãy tiếp tục làm việc và chu toàn bổn phận của mình. Trong bài Phúc Âm xác quyết về ngày bế mạc của thế giới thì không chắc chắn. Sẽ có những điềm lạ xảy ra trước khi ngày tận thế, và chúng ta sẽ được gọi đến trước mặt vua chúa quan quyền để làm chứng cho Chúa. Dấu chỉ tốt là những ai bền vững tới cùng thì Thiên Chúa sẽ cứu linh hồn họ và vào hưởng hạnh phúc muôn đời. Việc trở lại của Chúa Giêsu là điều mà chúng ta vui mừng vì Ngài sẽ trao lại vạn vật cho Thiên Chúa Cha. Vì thế chúng ta đọc trong thánh lễ "Chúng con tuyên xưng Chúa đã Chết, chúng con tuyên xưng Chúa Sống Lại, cho tới khi Chúa lại đến." Bởi vì cộng đoàn của Luka đang chịu nhiều sự bắt bớ, bài phúc âm hôm nay cho họ niềm vui là đừng bỏ cuộc Thiên Chúa luôn hiện diện với chúng ta. Chúa Giêsu cũng hứa với các Tông Đồ là Thiên Chúa sẽ ủng hộ họ để họ kiên vững trong đức tin và hành động. Chúa Giêsu cũng nói thêm về những dấu hiệu của sự tàn phá của thành Giêrusalem và ngày tận thế để chuẩn bị cho các Tông Đồ là họ hãy phó thác vào Thiên Chúa thay vì chính họ.

Chúng ta hãy sửa soạn hằng ngày cho sự chết và sự phán xét riêng của chúng ta. Chúng ta chuẩn bị bằng cách làm theo Thánh ý Chúa sống cuộc sống thánh thiện, nhân ái dẫu lòng thương xót và tha thứ vô điều kiện. Mỗi ngày chúng ta hãy xét mình, đọc Kinh Thánh và xin Chúa thứ tha để chúng ta chuẩn bị cho cái chết của chúng ta.

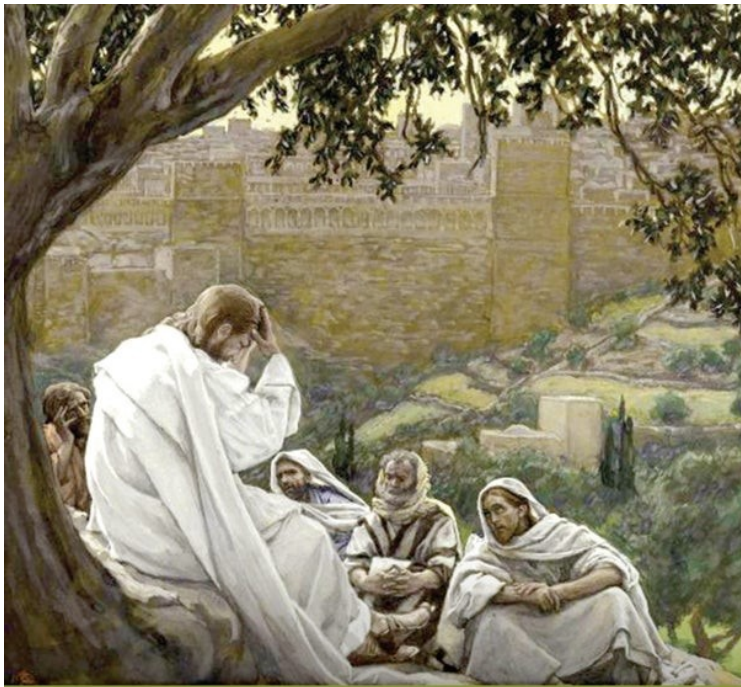
¡Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo!

El tema de las lecturas de hoy es la resistencia, o la esperanza de confianza, para "El Día del Señor" o la "Segunda Venida" de Jesús en gloria, como Juez, en el fin del mundo. Nos advierten sobre los últimos días del mundo, nuestra propia muerte y el juicio final. Malaquías, en la primera lectura, predice este Día, que traerá curación y recompensa por los justos y castigo en el fuego para los "orgullosos y todos los malvados". Aunque San Pablo esperaba que Jesús regresara durante su vida, advierte a los Tesalonicenses, en la segunda lectura, contra la ociosidad al anticipar el fin del mundo. Pablo aconseja a los Tesalonicenses que la mejor preparación para dar la bienvenida a Jesús en su "Segunda Venida" es seguir trabajando y cumpliendo fielmente con sus deberes, como lo hizo. El pasaje del Evangelio de hoy aclara que la fecha del fin del mundo es incierta. Señales y portentos precederán al final, y los cristianos serán llamados a testificar ante reyes y gobernadores. La buena noticia es que aquellos que perseveran en la fidelidad al Señor salvarán sus almas y entrarán en el reino eterno de Dios. La Segunda Venida de Cristo es algo para celebrar porque él va a presentar toda la creación a su Padre Celestial. Por eso decimos en la misa: "Proclamamos tu muerte, oh, Señor, y profesamos tu resurrección, hasta que vengas de nuevo". Dado que la comunidad de Lucas había experimentado mucha persecución, el Evangelio de hoy les da un recordatorio alegre: no te rindas porque Dios siempre está con nosotros. La promesa de Jesús del poder protector de proporcionar a Dios tenía el propósito de alentar a sus discípulos a perseverar en la fe y su práctica. Más tarde, Jesús agrega las señales de la destrucción de Jerusalén y el fin del mundo, para preparar a sus discípulos y recordarles que confíen en él para la salvación, no en su propio poder.

Debemos estar preparados diariamente para nuestra muerte y juicio privado. Hacemos esta preparación tratando de hacer la voluntad de Dios todos los días, llevando vidas santas de amor desinteresado, misericordia, compasión y perdón incondicional. Para hacer esto, debemos recargar nuestras baterías espirituales todos los días mediante la oración personal, es decir, hablando con Dios y escuchándolo, leyendo la Biblia. El examen diario de nuestra conciencia a la hora de dormir, pidiendo el perdón y el perdón de Dios por los pecados del día, también nos preparará para enfrentar a Dios en cualquier momento y dar cuenta de nuestras vidas. Necesitamos lograr la permanencia en un mundo que pasa llevando vidas ejemplares. Debemos recordar que nuestros hogares, nuestras iglesias e incluso nuestras propias vidas son temporales. Dios juzga nuestra grandeza, no por nuestros logros mundanos, sino por nuestra fidelidad a nuestra fe y su práctica en nuestro servicio amoroso a los demás.

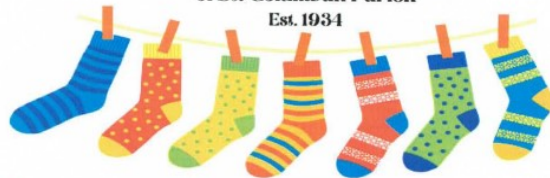
