PASTORAL SERVICES APPEAL

Pastor's Corner

Sunday, July 6, 2025

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ!

This past Friday, July 4, we joyfully celebrated the Independence Day of the United States, giving thanks to God for blessing this country. Let us continue to thank God for allowing us to live in one of the freest and happiest nations on earth. We kindly ask for your continued contributions to the 2025 Diocesan Pastoral Service Appeal so that we may have the financial means to replace the air conditioning system in our church. May the Lord bless and bestow abundant graces upon each one of us.

Today's Scriptures remind us that announcing the Good News of the Kingdom by words, deeds, and life is not the task of only a few. Rather, it is a task for all baptized Christians. In the first reading, Isaiah sees the city of Jerusalem as the prototype of the rejoicing Church—the Church who comforts her children, *"as a mother comforts her baby son."* He assures his listeners that they live in the certainty of Yahweh's promises of love, protection, prosperity, and salvation. In today's second reading (Galatians 6: 14-18), Paul clearly teaches that it was Jesus' death on the cross which brings one salvation and not a Jewish heritage. He reminds us that every Christian is called to be a "new creature", and that the mission of each member of the Church is to bear witness to the saving power of the cross of Christ through a life of sacrificial, self-giving service. Today's Gospel, taken from the Gospel of Luke, describes, in Jesus' commissioning of 72 disciples, to preach the Gospel in towns and villages in preparation for his visit, the fulfillment of the prophetic promise made by Isaiah. He gives them "travel tips" for their missionary journey. They must be walking witnesses of God's providence by relying on the hospitality of others, living very simple lives, preaching the Good News and healing the sick. Today's Gospel reminds us that the 1.5 billion Christians in the world today have the same mission to preach the Gospel of Christ to the other 4.5 billion non-Christians.

This week, the valuable lesson for us to put into action is that we need to continue the preaching mission. Just as Jesus, in today's Gospel, gave instructions to the seventy-two missionaries, he also gives each one of us a mission to carry out: as faithful Christians, we should attract others to the Faith by leading exemplary lives, just as a rose attracts people by its beauty and fragrance. This is our job and our responsibility. We must not miss the current opportunities to be apostles through our words and deeds in everyday life. We need to avoid giving the counter-witness of practicing the "supermarket Catholicism" of our politicians who publicly proclaim their "Catholicism" and yet support abortion, gay marriage, human cloning, and experimentation with human embryos. Nor should we be "armchair Catholics", "cafeteria Catholics", or "Sunday Catholics" who bear counter-witness to Christ through our lives. Let us start preaching the Gospel in our families by leading exemplary Christian lives, in which spouses love and respect each other, raise their children in the spirit of obedience and service, discipline them with forgiving love, and teach them by persistent example to pray, love, and help others by sharing their blessings.

Lời Chúa trong Chúa Nhật 14 Quanh Năm hôm nay nhắc nhở chúng ta về việc loan báo Tin Mừng về Nước Thiên Chúa bằng lời nói hành động và cuộc sống không phải dành cho một số ít. Nhưng đó là việc làm của tất cả những ai đã được rửa tội. Trong bài đọc thứ nhất Tiên Tri Isaia nhìn thấy Thành Giêrusalem như là một giáo hội vui tươi - Giáo Hội an ủi con cái mình "như người mẹ ấp ủ con mình", Ngài xác quyết với những khán thính giả rằng họ đang sống trong lời hứa của Thiên Chúa Yawê là tình thương bảo vệ phần thịnh và ơn cứu độ. Bài đọc thứ hai Thánh Phaolô gởi cho Giáo Đoàn Galata Ngài dạy chúng ta rằng qua cái chết của Chúa Kitô trên Thập Giá Ngài đem lại ơn cứu độ cho mọi người. Thánh Phaolô cũng nhắc nhở chúng ta mỗi Kitô hữu được gọi là "tạo vật mới" là chúng ta hãy làm chứng nhân cho Thập Giá Đức Kitô qua việc hy sinh và phục vụ nhau. Bài Phúc Âm trích từ Tin Mừng của Thánh Luka diễn tả về việc Chúa Giêsu sai 72 môn đệ đi vào các thành phố và làng mạc để sửa soạn cho việc thăm viếng của Chúa. Hôm nay lời Chúa cũng nhắc nhở mỗi người chúng ta rằng hiện nay có 1.5 tỷ người Công Giáo trên thế giới chúng ta cũng phải có trách nhiệm làm việc loan báo Tin Mừng của Chúa Kitô cho 4.5 tỷ người chưa nhận biết Chúa.

Bài học cho mỗi người chúng ta tiếp tục rao giảng Tin Mừng của Chúa Kitô trong thế giới hôm nay. Chúng ta phải sống niềm tin của Chúa Kitô. Chúng ta sống Phúc Âm của Chúa Kitô bắt đầu từ nơi gia đình, vợ chồng con cái cùng kính trọng nhau, giáo dục con cái theo tinh thần phục vụ và kính trọng, hãy tha thứ cho con cái mình khi nó có lỗi, hãy dạy cho con cái biết cách cầu nguyện, cho nhau tình thương và giúp đỡ những người khác.

Notas del Párroco

Domingo, Julio 6, 2025

¡Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo!

El pasado viernes 4 de julio celebramos con gran alegría el Día de la Independencia de los Estados Unidos, agradeciendo a Dios por haber bendecido a este país. Continuamos dando gracias a Dios por permitirnos vivir en una de las naciones más libres y felices del planeta. Respetuosamente pedimos a ustedes, queridos hermanos y hermanas, que sigan contribuyendo al Fondo Pastoral Diocesano 2025, para que podamos contar con los recursos necesarios para renovar el sistema de aire acondicionado de nuestra iglesia. Que el Señor los bendiga y derrame abundantes gracias sobre cada uno de nosotros.

Las Escrituras de hoy nos recuerdan que anunciar la Buena Nueva del Reino por medio de palabras, hechos y vida no es tarea de unos pocos. Más bien, es una tarea para todos los cristianos bautizados. En la primera lectura, Isaías ve a la ciudad de Jerusalén como el prototipo de la Iglesia que se regocija, la Iglesia que consuela a sus hijos, "como una madre que consuela a su hijo". Amor, protección, prosperidad y salvación. En la segunda lectura de hoy (Gálatas 6: 14-18), Pablo claramente enseña que fue la muerte de Jesús en la cruz lo que trae una salvación y no una herencia judía. Nos recuerda que todo cristiano está llamado a ser una "nueva criatura", y que la misión de cada miembro de la Iglesia es dar testimonio del poder salvador de la cruz de Cristo a través de una vida de servicio de sacrificio y entrega. El Evangelio de hoy, tomado del Evangelio de Lucas, describe, en la comisión de 72 discípulos de Jesús, a predicar el Evangelio en pueblos y aldeas en preparación para su visita, el cumplimiento de la promesa profética hecha por Isaías. El les da "consejos de viaje" para su viaje misionero. Deben ser testigos ambulantes de la providencia de Dios al confiar en la hospitalidad de los demás, llevar una vida muy sencilla, predicar la Buena Nueva y sanar a los enfermos. El Evangelio de hoy nos recuerda que los 1.500 millones de cristianos en el mundo de hoy tienen la misma misión de predicar el Evangelio de Cristo a los otros 4.500 millones de no cristianos.

Esta semana, la valiosa lección que debemos poner en acción es que debemos continuar la misión de predicación. Así como Jesús, en el Evangelio de hoy, dio instrucciones a los setenta y dos misioneros, también nos encomienda a cada uno de nosotros una misión que cumplir: como cristianos fieles, debemos atraer a otros a la Fe llevando una vida ejemplar, como una rosa atrae a las personas por su belleza y fragancia. Este es nuestro trabajo y nuestra responsabilidad. No debemos perder las oportunidades actuales de ser apóstoles a través de nuestras palabras y acciones en la vida cotidiana. Debemos evitar dar el contra testimonio de practicar el "catolicismo de supermercados" de nuestros políticos que públicamente proclaman su "catolicismo" y, sin embargo, apoyan el aborto, el matrimonio gay, la clonación humana y la experimentación con embriones humanos. Tampoco debemos ser "católicos de sillón", "católicos de cafetería" o "católicos dominicales" que son testigos de Cristo a través de nuestras vidas. Comencemos a predicar el Evangelio en nuestras familias llevando vidas cristianas ejemplares, en las que los esposos se aman y se respetan, crían a sus hijos en el espíritu de obediencia y servicio, los disciplinamos con amor perdonador y les enseñamos con un ejemplo persistente de oración. Ama, y ayuda a otros compartiendo sus bendiciones.

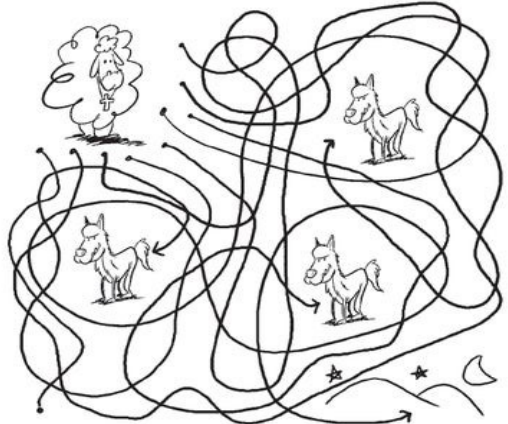
