



#### **Anthony Julius**



Deputy Chairman at international law firm Mishcon de Reya and holds the Chair in Law and Arts in the Faculty of Laws, UCL. As a lawyer, he is best known for his successful defence of historian Deborah Lipstadt in the libel case brought by David Irving. As a scholar, he is the author of the widely praised Trials of the Diaspora: A History of Anti-Semitism in England, amongst other books

Studied at City of London School. Spent three years at the legendary Chevron Yeshiva, Jerusalem and then graduated in Philosophy at the London School of Economics. Also is Director of Education at Yad Vashem UK.
