# MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD PRESIDENT AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

### THE FUTURE IS NOW...

Somehow, amidst the coming and going of children, parents, faculty, staff, and work on the school's daily tasks and strategic goals, four-and-a-half decades have slipped by.

Since 1978, the school has experienced tremendous growth and development. Over that time, MSLF has embarked on several ambitious projects, including the construction of our current facility, to unite previously dispersed programs. The addition of Elementary classrooms, a multipurpose room, and a Parent Infant program to accommodate increased enrollment; development of our Outdoor Learning and Discovery Project; and finally the opening of an Adolescent Program at Prairie Crossing completed our initial cycle of growth.

For more than 46 years, the Montessori School of Lake Forest has relied on the proven, century-old Montessori Method to provide the foundation for its educational and enrichment programs.

MSLF began its most recent cycle in the strategic planning process in the spring of 2009, with two parallel surveys that went to every member of the MSLF parent and faculty communities. We undertook the surveys to gather information about the state of affairs at MSLF from an internal perspective. We received responses to these surveys from families representing close to half of the children enrolled at MSLF, and from almost the entire faculty.

The following year, we undertook a comparative market review to create a foundation of information from which to evaluate MSLF's offerings and to understand how they compare with competitive and model schools. During the 2009-2010 school year another special strategic planning subcommittee, led by a parent volunteer with professional expertise in this area, a committee comprised of parents, faculty, two Board members, and the Executive Director, reviewed and revised the school's Vision, Mission, and Values statement. The draft was approved by the faculty and the Board of Directors and has provided the framework for our current three-year strategic plan. All the plan's recommendations are important enough to be primary goals for the first year, but we cannot accomplish everything in one year and do it well. The second and third year recommendations will provide a roadmap for the transition of the new Executive Director, Mark Berger.

The strategic planning process itself has been revealing, and events have shifted priorities even as we've worked on the plan. For example, we have evaluated our approach to Parent Education, focusing our presentations not only on sharing what Montessori is, but also on opening a conversation across all levels (Parent Infant through Adolescent) about the value and the outcomes of a Montessori education. We have also looked at our administrative structure and added the position of Director of Education and Admissions, a part-time position of Director of Communications, and a part-time Special Event Coordinator.

The cornerstone of Montessori philosophy is that when given the right tools and the right guidance in the right environment, children can and will gain the self-confidence necessary to build their futures. Each Montessori environment and material represents another building block in the construction of a child's world and collective experience.

This past year, we put another building block for our future into place as we researched the feasibility of adding to our Adolescent Program building, which MSLF children of all ages lovingly call "the Blue House." Our Adolescent Program's work and study process emerges from direct contact with the surrounding land and activities associated with it. The woods, meadow, and farm at Prairie Crossing have become an important part of the Montessori prepared environment for our adolescents. Farm activities lead our students to studies of, among other things, farm science, land management and ecology, biology, chemistry, mathematics, accounting, geometry, history, economic systems, algebra, physics, energy, environmental issues, and technology and information systems.

Our Adolescent Program, long a dream at the Administrative and Board levels, has just completed its 9th year of producing steadily good results: our students go on to successful high school careers at a wide variety of public and private schools. Our goal to expand "the Blue House" represents a continuation of the commitment the MSLF community made long ago, to provide a complete Montessori education.

Now, that education is being further enhanced by Chicago area-wide efforts to develop a Montessori high school. This year's parent survey about a Montessori high school vision resulted in a very strong show of interest from families of many Montessori schools, including MSLF. We are confident in the future of this vision.

Over the years, MSLF has grown and changed as we have adapted in order to continue to meet the needs of students today and into the future. Only by addressing the future needs of our community can we continue to maintain our high standards for ourselves and serve as a role model to others.

MSLF continues to excel and set the standard for the finest Montessori educational program in the nation. We look forward to the continued implementation of MSLF's goals with optimism and faith in our community's collaborative effort to serve the children.





### **FINANCE COMMITTEE**

Vicki Stach, Chair

The Finance Committee works with staff to prepare the school's annual operating and capital budgets, and long-range financial plan; monitors all financial activity in greater detail than the Board as a whole; develops financial policies; and brings all such items to the Board for its approval, along with regular financial reports for the Board's information. This committee works closely with the school's Executive Director.

Over the course of the school year, the Committee on Finance facilitated preparation of the fiscal year 2011-2012 Budget recommendation, allocation of Financial Aid, and selection of an independent Auditor. In addition to providing oversight of financial statements and bond covenant compliance, the committee also reviewed financial related policies, ensured the achievement of the financial goals and objectives included in MSLF's Strategic Plan, and assisted with the Fundraising Committee goals.



### **FUNDRAISING COMMITTEE**

Nicole Korczak and Humberto Martinez, Jr., Co-chairs The Fundraising Committee maintains general oversight of MSLF's fundraising plans, both long-range and annual.

This year MSLF raised \$92,540 during the 2010-2011 Annual Giving Campaign. Donations were solicited from a wide range of potential donors, including parents, teachers and staff, Board, alumni, corporations and grandparents, with a participation rate of 60% from parents and 100% from teachers, staff and Board. The funds raised help support improvements to the school's operations, facilities, and programing at both campuses. The Committee worked jointly with our Executive Director, Lissa Hektor, to ensure a successful campaign.

### **MARKETING COMMITTEE**

The Marketing Committee is committed to promoting the growth and expansion of knowledge of the school, its facilities, and the Montessori philosophy. This committee acts as a resource and a consultant to other committees and the Board.

This year the committee:

### STRATEGIC PLANNING COMMITTEE

Working together with MSLF's Executive Director, faculty and staff, this "vision" oriented committee develops, reviews, updates, and amends the three-year strategic plan. It recommends action plans to the Board and measures progress annually.

Referencing MSLF's new Vision, Mission and Values statements and our five strategic goals, subcommittees composed of parents, faculty, administration, and Board members constructed objectives and strategies to provide the framework to be used in achieving our goals. These detailed plans were sequenced logically over a three-year time period, resulting in a comprehensive plan. The strategic plan was approved by the Board, even as work had already commenced to meet the goals. The committee also established an objective framework to evaluate progress toward the various goals and objectives of the strategic plan. The framework will provide the Board with a means to evaluate success, as well as identify and address issues that arise during the school year.



### **FACILITIES COMMITTEE**

The Facilities Committee supports the maintenance and development of both MSLF Campuses. This committee works with the Executive Director and faculty to continue to sustain MSLF's Montessori vision in all of its environments.

This year the facilities committee accomplished many things. We addressed the Laurel Drive campus' leaky roof over the south end of the building. A new tipi was erected, Hektor Grove was created and over a dozen native oak trees and shrubs were planted. Bird feeders were installed in each of the classrooms courtyards, in keeping with the Audubon Society guidelines. The Blue House has a new kitchen which will enable the adolescent students to make and serve hot meals.
