

Mission


Cultivate in every MSLF child a life-long love of learning.

Greetings from MSLF

The Montessori School of Lake Forest accomplished our 48th year anniversary during the 2014-15 school year - what an amazing accomplishment! Soon we will celebrate our 50th anniversary, and we are excited about the potential of our students because we know they will continue to fulfill the year's theme as they continue to "Dare to Soar!"

Fortunately for each student and family, MSLF has the tools in place for the whole community to meet that potential. Our organizational excellence begins at the top, under the leadership of Executive Director Ann Jordahl, and extends throughout our professional faculty and staff. The combination of Montessori principles and the collaborative efforts



of our team of educators provide the foundation that assures our students will soar during the coming year.

The 2014-2015 school year included a number of celebrations and an interesting variety of parent educational programs. As you participated in these events, you had unique opportunities to experience how the principles of a Montessori Education help students evolve in relevant, measureable ways, preparing your student with the skills required to reach their full potential. I strongly encourage parents to spend more time observing classrooms, not only where your child is today, but also those they will attend in future years.

Our other standing committees - the Finance Committee, the Committee on Directors and our Head Support and Evaluation Committee - met regularly to assure MSLF would be ready to meet the challenge of our future, as well.

As we looked forward to our next half-century, we agreed that in the coming year we would reevaluate our five-year Strategic Plan. We also made progress in another critical area: succession planning at the Board level. Our Board is stronger today than it has ever been in the past. Message from the Executive Director

Dear Members of the Montessori School of Lake Forest Community,

Past, Present, Future: MSLF always has been and always will be a place where children and their families come first. This value lies at the heart of Montessori education, and it informs every step that parents, children, and teachers take together at the Montessori School of Lake Forest.

Founded nearly 50 years ago as a parent study group, MSLF evolved into a "full service" school, dedicated to supporting the whole development of every child who enters its doors. As proud as we are of every student at graduation, we grow even prouder as we hear the reports of their high school teachers, and as we welcome them as teenage and young adult alumni.



Our MSLF alumni, resourceful and responsible, "literate, numerate, and ethical" (to quote Maria Montessori), are entering a wide range of professions, because they are interested and capable. The doors of their minds, and thus of their lives, are open, and they succeed by building opportunity after opportunity for themselves, in large ways and small.

How did they learn to do this? And why, even amongst their peers at prestigious high schools and colleges, are they so unique in their ability to build opportunity for themselves?

I speak as their witness of many years: They learned how to build opportunity by doing it from early child-hood, day by day, in their Montessori school, as your children are doing now. From the youngest MSLF child to the oldest, every child learns how to set a goal and reach it; how to make a decision and live with it; how to communicate a need to get it met; how to set a limit and accept a limit; how to dream a dream and how to work to make that dream come true. ANNUAL GIVING

The Montessori School of Lake Forest's Annual Giving campaign is the foundation of the school's fundraising activities. Tuition covers only 90% of the annual budget requirements, and the remaining 10% comes from generous donors. Annual Giving contributions supplement the operating budget, therefore avoiding the need for higher tuition. MSLF asks "every family, every year" to show its commitment to the school by supporting Annual Giving. Each

contribution makes it possible for MSLF to continue providing exceptional education programs and a diverse socio-economic learning environment.

We are pleased to report that MSLF raised \$80,654.89 during the 2014-2015 Annual Giving Campaign, with generous gifts from the Board of Directors, faculty and staff, and parent community. The funds raised go toward supporting capital improvements to the school, as well as ongoing operations and programming at both campuses.

Year in Review





















The Annual MSLF Benefit, the school's largest fundraiser, was held on April 11, 2015. The Carver/Mancuso Family generously donated Lake Forest Sportscars as the venue for the event. Kirstin Carruthers served as Benefit Chair, and Laura Fosselman served as Benefit Co-Chair.

The benefit theme, "Dare to Soar," exemplified what our children do at school on a daily basis. The Montessori School of Lake Forest gives children the tools, the encouragement, and the permission to spread their wings. Students of all ages think on their own, challenging themselves intellectually, physically, socially and personally. They are reaching their potentials.



Each year, the Benefit includes a Paddle Raiser in support of a specific school initiative. In 2014-2015, the focus was technology, specifically, a new audiovisual system and updated technology throughout the school.

Together, we raised \$31,750 to enhance technology on both campuses and to install a new audio-visual system in the multipurpose room. The new technology will allow students to research and create presentations, slide shows, play and other performances.
