# Reading the Bible

- Most of us read the Bible primarily for our own spiritual well being (prayerful reading)
- Some however, may read the Bible for:
  - Serious theological study (faith based)
  - Serious scholastic study (secular)
  - Public reading (lectors)
  - Critical analysis (historical, scientific, literary)
  - Curiosity
- Prayerful readers sometimes step across the line into theological study (whether intentionally or unintentionally,,, it happens)

#### Beware Academic Seduction



## Do Not Put God in a Box!


- Remember as you read: God is eternal and completely without limits
- God is the creator of everything humanity has discovered and everything yet to be discovered about our physical universe
- Beware putting human limits on God the unlimited creator of the universe



# Bible in Context

- The Bible is a library of books with many different literary genres (CCC 110)
  - It contains; poetry, songs, letters, history, myth, prayers, parables, stories, etc.... (i.e. GN 1-11)
- "In Sacred Scripture, God speaks to man in a human way" (CCC 109)
- Remember the social, cultural, and traditional setting where/when the inspired author lived
- Man's mind is remains finite, even when supernaturally elevated by divine revelation


- 1. The literary form

## The Bible is a Journey


- View the Bible as our human journey through a growing awareness of God and our universe
- The <u>written</u> revelation of God's <u>limitless love</u> spanned over 2000 years of salvation history and was not fully revealed until the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ
- Everything in the Bible is truth for our salvation,,,
- But you must use the whole Bible to discover Biblical truth (beware cherry-picking by verse)
- "Be especially attentive to the content and unity of the whole Scripture" (CCC 112)

## The Bible is a Love Story

- Never forget; the Bible is the Inspired Word of God, free from error, teaching what God desires us to know "for the sake of our salvation!"
- It teaches what we need to:
  - Be in right relationship with God (covenant love)
  - Know with absolute certainty God does love us
  - Know what God would have us do to build up His kingdom of love on earth
- Always seek "salvation truth" and don't stumble over historical or scientific inconsistencies
- Always remember; The Bible is a Book of Faith!

# The Bible Story and "Predestination"

God exists in eternity

 "To God, all moments of time are present in their immediacy. When therefore He establishes His eternal plan of 'predestination,' He includes in it each persons freely given response." CCC 600

 God immediately knows every "yes" and every "no" ever spoken throughout eternity but God never forces anyone's response.

#### Prepare Before you Read

- Sit quietly in silence and ask the Holy Spirit in prayer to guide your Scriptural reading
- Achieve a calm and tranquil state of mind
- Ask Jesus to be present (maybe light a candle)

#### Read the Bible First

- "My personal advice:" Do Not start with a scholar's commentary before you read the Bible
- You may inadvertently prevent God from speaking directly to your heart because you've allowed a scholar to tell you "what it means" first

# Speak Lord

- As you finish your reading always sit quietly, open your heart, and allow God to speak
- "Speak Lord, for your servant is listening"
  - 1 Samuel 3:9
- Pray as you finish
  - Contemplate what you've read
  - Surrender to the Lord (this is hard to do)
  - Be willing to change (even harder to do)

# Lectio Divina (Divine Reading)

#### likened to "Feasting On the Word"

- First take a bite READ slowly (Lectio)
- Next you chew on it MEDITATE
- Savor the essence of it PRAY
- Digest the word and make it part of your body and the soul – CONTEMPLATE
