Beloved Congregation,

It is hard to believe we are already in the month of November. God continues to bless our congregation and we have much to be thankful for during this season of harvest. There are some updates to important matters I would like to share.

The Interfaith Housing Coalition has finalized a partnership with Habitat for Humanity and renovations on the old clinic will begin this month. Once the building is converted into a three-bedroom home we will be able to seek out our first family in need of transitional housing. I want to express gratitude to those who are tirelessly donating their time to this important mission and ministry and to those who have financially supported it. It is truly humbling to see what can be accomplished by people of faith when we work together.

The Ecumenical Thanksgiving Service is in process. As I write this, we are still looking for a location for the event. We will share with you the when and where as soon as we know.

Finally, two items concerning the opportunity to serve those in need.

Donations to Local Food Pantries may be very important this month. With the government shut down, many families are going to face the reality of not having food to put on the table because the SNAP benefits are set to expire on Nov. 1. One way to help is to make a financial gift to Lake Shore Cap or Feed My People. I also have a Pastor's Discretionary Fund available to help members of the congregation who may be struggling during this time.

Hurricane Melissa in Jamaica went ashore right at our Moravian Camp Hope where so many of our youth and adults have lived and worked in our partnership with the Moravians in Jamaica. At this moment we know nothing of the damage or what the needs may be, but it is reasonable to assume they will be significant. I have been so touched by how many of our folks, who have been on past mission trips, have reached out to me wanting to know what they can do to help. We rely on the Board of World Mission to let us know what is needed once they have been able to assess the damage. Please pray for the folks living in Whitehouse and St. Elizabeth Parish. We will let you know as soon as we can about plans going forward to offer assistance.

UNITY PRAYER WATCH - December 5, 2025

Shortly after the August 13, 1727 communion, the Moravians established an "Hourly Intercession," believing continual prayer was an absolute essential for the Church to grow and thrive under the leading of God's spirit. That daily "Prayer Watch" continued unbroken for one hundred years, with Moravians in prayer every day, 365 days of the year. During the 1957 celebration of the 500th anniversary of the Moravian Church, the Prayer Watch was re-established; inviting congregations around the world to each take responsibility for a day of prayer. **Our assigned day of prayer is December 5.** We are sharing this day with other Moravian congregations. There will be a sign up sheet in the Coffee Hus on Sunday's. If you would like a copy of the Unity Prayer Watch Topics list please call the office. Our prayer times are 2:00 am to 11:30 am and 2:00 pm to 11:30 pm, every half hour. If you wish to take a time, or two, please respond by email or call the church office and we will add you to the list.
