Dinner with Friends, an Opportunity to Serve

There was a lot of sadness for many of us when Loaves and Fishes had to cease during COVID. Since then our friends at Bayview Lutheran have picked up the torch and have been offering a community meal program once a month called **Dinner with Friends**. As we well know, the need for this is great and they are at the point that they need our help!

They offer a dine-in meal service & carry out that starts at 4:30 and goes until 6 pm on the second Saturday of the month, which means the next meal will be December 13th.

This meal, like Loaves and Fishes is free. Typically they have 10 take out and 30 in the church dining room, but a large portion of what they do is delivery. They have been delivering about 100-110 meals each month, mostly shut ins, families with small kids, and the elderly who don't want to drive.

They need:

people to prep foods on Fridays people to deliver meals people to serve at the dine-in people to help cook.
