Project Spotlight

North Branch Ecorse Creek Drain

Burman's contributed to the restoration of the North Branch Ecorse Creek Drain in Wayne County, a multi million dollar stormwater improvement project supported by a \$10M federal ARPA grant and a broader \$70M county wide budget.

Our work included clearing obstructions, stabilizing banks, and removing hazardous trees to prepare for long term site redevelopment and improved drainage.
