Jesus was starting to become very popular, at least with the ordinary people. They had seen how he had cured the sick and cast out demons. We can follow Paul's example of love for all people no matter who they are. Paul's love was not to make others like him. He genuinely wanted to bring the good news to them: by his love for them, Paul showed that God loves them even more. Let us ask the Lord to fill us with his love, so that we can help each other to hear the good news.
