From the desk of Father Wayne:

Funerals and Cremations

One of the Spiritual works of mercy is to pray for and bury the dead. I am reminded to tell you that we do not just celebrate funeral for Catholics. I have been asked to do funeral for someone who is not Catholic. The Funeral Rite is of the Church to remind us that death unequivocally confronts the mystery of life and death in our personal story of faith, the loving family bonds, the friendships and the words and acts of kindness of the deceased person. It is first and foremost to thank God for the life which the deceased had been given from God and the connection especially as we are connected in faith by baptism, anointing and fed at the Eucharistic banquet. We the Christian faithful pray support and care for those loved ones who have been left to remind us of the everlasting life which God offers us. Funeral services and Masses of Christian Burial offers us the sacred time and Rites of the Church.

There has been some confusion over the last few years since the Catholic Church has allowed for the cremations of loved ones with certain guidelines concerning the liturgies and committal of the cremains.

In 1997, after request from the USCCB- United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, the Apostolic See gave an indult to permit the diocesan bishop to allow the presence of the cremated remains of a body at the funeral liturgy in dioceses of the United States. This indult permitted the Funeral Liturgy where the texts and ritual adaptations for the celebration of the Funeral Liturgy.

When one wishes to have the body of the deceased family member or friends to be cremated it may be done after the Liturgy of Christian Burial with the body present for the service or after the body is cremated. The Churches stance on Cremation is that the same respect for the cremated remains must be shown as if you had a body for a funeral. Our bodies are a temple of the Holy Spirit and should be treated with the same respect that is shown to a body prepared for burial. This is very important because due to the Commercialization of Funeral Home Services we have seen examples of wanting to take the remains and placing them in pendants or jewelry to take the loved one with them wherever they may be. This is in direct opposition to the Churches stance to keep the cremains intact. No scattering of ashes, no sprinkling at sea or lake or mountain, no placing them on a shelf or in a drawer in the house.

The Churches official stance is that the Cremains (The Ashes of the body) <u>must be kept intact to bury or placed in a niche or Columbarium- a place where urns of Cremains are placed like a Mausoleum.</u>

The Church does allow for someone to be cremated before the Mass of Christian Burial with the cremation placed on a pedestal and placing of a Pall (smaller than one for a casket) as one would for a funeral. Either the funeral director or a family member would bring in the urn and placing it on the pedestal for the Mass. The Pascual (Easter) Candle is placed near the urn just as we would with a casket. When the Mass is complete with those there for internment are proceeded to the cemetery.

In conclusion, the Church's Rites for Christian Burial with its prayers for the Church honors the remains of the deceased, always focusing on our relationship to God. We would be remised to not show the respect that is due as a created of God.


The purpose of this Meal Train Ministry is to provide a hot meal on Wednesday night for our PREP students. This gives them time for fellowship together prior to instruction beginning.
