4th Sunday of Advent

Have you ever been told to "think before you speak"? Nathan seems to have spoken too soon when he told David to do whatever he wanted about building a house for the LORD. But later that night the God gave him a message for David: the LORD did not need anyone to build him a house; God would make David's house (in the sense of family or descendants) last forever. That can be a lesson to us. Instead of just thinking before we speak, it could be a good idea to pray before we speak.

How many times have we said something in anger (or selfishness, fear, any strong feeling) that we wished we could take back? If we just think before we speak, we might just rationalize what we wanted to say in the first place. But if you take a little more time to bring our feelings to God, ask for guidance and listen for what God would have us say, things might turn out a lot better. We pray before meals; why not pray before going to work? We can pray before making decisions about our family, getting engaged, taking a new job, buying a new house/car/HD-TV, etc. When a friend or relative needs someone to talk to, we can pray that we listen well and say what God wants our friend to hear. If we have enough faith to let God guide our lives, let's take the time in prayer to listen for that guidance. Tom Schmidt

¿Alguna vez te han dicho que debes "pensar antes de hablar"? Parece que Natán había hablado muy pronto cuando le dijo a David que hiciera lo que quisiera para construir una casa para el Señor. Pero más tarde esa misma noche el Señor le concedió un mensaje para David: el Señor no necesitaba que nadie le construyera una casa; Dios haría que la casa de David (en el sentido de familia o descendientes) durara para siempre. Esto puede ser una lección para nosotros. En lugar de simplemente pensar antes de hablar, podría ser una buena idea rezar antes de hablar.

¿Cuántas veces hemos dicho algo con ira (o por egoísmo, miedo o cualquier sentimiento fuerte) que quisiéramos poder retractarnos? Si pensamos antes de hablar, podríamos simplemente racionalizar lo que queríamos decir al inicio. Pero si nos tomamos un tiempo más para presentarle nuestros sentimientos a Dios, pedirle que nos guíe y escuchar lo que Dios quiere que digamos, las cosas podrían resultar mucho mejores. Rezamos antes de comer, ¿Por qué no rezar antes de ir al trabajo? Podemos rezar antes de tomar decisiones sobre nuestra familia, comprometernos al matrimonio, aceptar un nuevo trabajo, comprar una nueva casa/carro/TV de alta definición, etc. Cuando un amigo o familiar necesita alguien con quien hablar, podemos rezar para que le escuchemos atentamente y luego decir lo que Dios quiere que le digamos a nuestro amigo. Si tenemos la fe suficiente para dejar que Dios guíe nuestras vidas, tomemos tiempo en oración para escuchar sus indicaciones.
