The Third Sunday of Advent

is known as "Gaudete Sunday." *Gaudete* means "rejoice!"

Saint Paul seems to be throwing out a handful of sayings that may sound overly optimistic, but are actually very practical. "Rejoice always"? If we pray constantly and thank God for all that happens to us, we have reason to rejoice. Even the things we don't like can be turned to good by God. God allows sin because it leads to forgiveness, an experience of God's love for us. And God allows even death, because God can bring us to eternal life.

When Paul tells us not to quench the Spirit he means we should be open to what the Holy Spirit moves us to do. "Prophetic utterances" refer to things that other people were inspired to proclaim. If we pray constantly (1 Thessalonians 5:17), the distractions of this world will not keep us from hearing the Spirit within us. We won't be so critical of others that we miss what the Spirit is telling us through them.

How do we know if something really is from the Spirit? Saint Paul says, test everything. Retain what is good (1 Thessalonians 5:21). Use the scriptures, the teachings of the Church, and your conscience to decide whether the Spirit is moving you, or if advice you hear is worthwhile. Trust God to make us holy if we only allow it. Then we will be ready for the coming of the Lord, whether through the sacraments, the celebration of Christmas, or God's final coming in glory. I'd say that's a reason to rejoice.

San Pablo parece estar lanzando unos cuantos dichos que pueden parecer demasiado optimistas, pero en realidad son muy prácticos. "¿Vivir siempre alegres?" Si rezamos constantemente y damos gracias a Dios por todo lo que nos sucede, tenemos motivo para alegrarnos. Incluso las cosas malas, las cosas que no nos gustan, pueden ser permitidas por Dios, para que Dios pueda sacar algo bueno de ellas. Dios permite el pecado porque nos conduce al perdón, una experiencia del amor de Dios por nosotros. Y Dios permite incluso la muerte, porque Dios puede llevarnos a la vida eterna. Cuando Pablo nos dice que no impidamos la acción del Espíritu quiere decir que debemos estar abiertos a lo que el Espíritu Santo nos mueve a hacer. "El don de profecía" se refiere a cosas que otras personas fueron inspiradas a proclamar. Si oramos sin cesar (1 Tesalonicenses 5,17) no estaremos tan distraídos por las cosas de este mundo que no podamos escuchar los impulsos del Espíritu Santo dentro de nosotros. No seremos tan críticos de los demás como para perdernos lo que el Espíritu nos quiere decir a través de ellos.

¿Cómo sabemos si algo realmente es del Espíritu? San Pablo dice, sométanlo todo a prueba y quédense con lo bueno (1 Tesalonicenses 5,21). Utiliza las Escrituras, las enseñanzas de la Iglesia y tu conciencia para decidir si el Espíritu te está moviendo o si el consejo que escuchas vale la pena. Confía en que Dios nos hará santos si sólo lo permitimos. Entonces estaremos listos para la venida del Señor, ya sea a través de los sacramentos, la celebración de la Navidad o la venida final de Dios en su gloria. Yo diría que eso es un buen motivo para alegrarse.
