Recently, my brother had to spend time at the Scunthorpe General Hospital in ward 25. He has severe learning difficulties, which makes situations like these difficult for him to understand and cope with. On being admitted to ward 25, he was introduced to Dr Chloe Groenewald on ward 5. Dr Chloe explained her understanding of his complex needs to myself and to my brother. She explained that this is her passion, to care and understand patients with complex needs, going forward in her future career. She offered help and

guidance to myself and my brother, on organisations that can help him. She also brought visual cards for my brother, to learn how to express his emotions, so people can understand him. He has never had any help like this before, and as a family, we often struggle to understand his emotions or needs. This idea has been a great help with his care within the hospital, and also his care going forward, with his future needs at home. I found Dr Chloe to be a very compassionate doctor, in my brother's needs. She contacted various organisations, with benefits that we did not know are available to him. We hope as a family, that Doctor Chloe will find full time employment, within the trust, as she is a great asset to the organisation, and a great ambassador for people with learning difficulties. We found Dr Chloe to be a lovely, approachable Doctor, regarding any questions we had for my brother, and feel she will make a great full time doctor at Scunthorpe General Hospital, if given the chance.

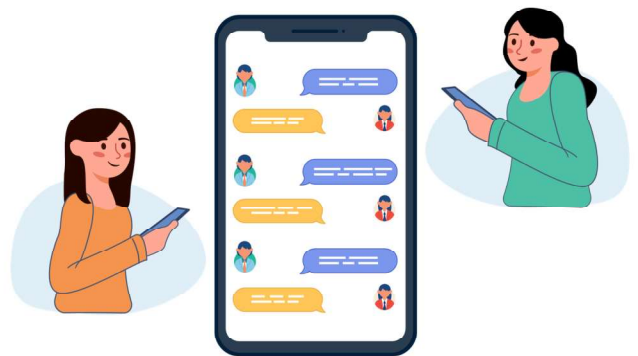
