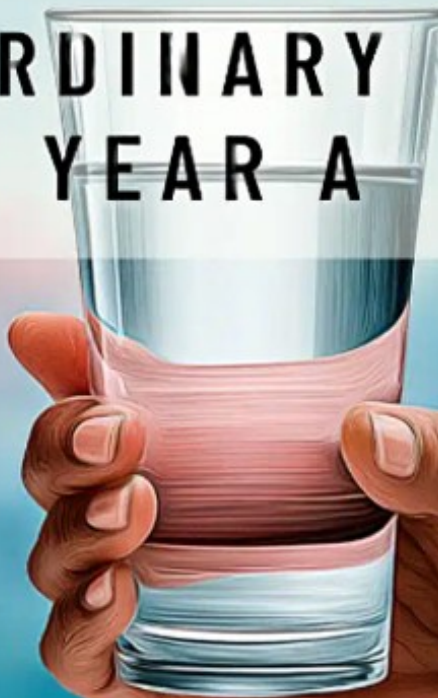

GROWING IN GOD'S GRACE

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

If we were asked to name an Old Testament prophet, many of us might think of familiar names such as Isaiah, Samuel, Ezekiel, or Elijah. But there is another prophet whose name is often overlooked—Elisha, the successor of Elijah.

In the First Reading, we hear about a generous woman who recognized Elisha as a holy man of God. She welcomed him into her home and provided food and lodging whenever he passed by. In return, Elisha, acting as God's prophet, blessed her with an extraordinary promise: “This time next year, you will hold a son in your arms.”

A prophet is not only one who proclaims God's word and interprets His will. A prophet is also a channel of God's blessings and healing for others.

One lesser-known story about Elisha illustrates this beautifully. The people complained that their water was polluted and their land had become unfruitful. Elisha went to the source of the water, invoked God's blessing, and sprinkled salt into it.

The water was purified, and healing came to both the land and the people. This action is reflected even today in the Church's blessing of holy water, where blessed salt may be added as a sign of purification and healing.

Not all prophets are formally recognized. Some people, though not called prophets, carry out a prophetic mission through their faith and actions.

We might remember the story of the Syro-Phoenician woman in the Bible. She approached Jesus, pleading for the healing of her daughter. Despite what seemed like rejection, she responded with remarkable humility and faith: “Even the house dogs feed on the crumbs that fall from their masters' table.” Moved by her faith, Jesus healed her daughter immediately.

Though she was not a prophet, her faith became a channel of God's healing. In that sense, she fulfilled a prophetic role.

Perhaps we can learn a similar lesson from our pets. If dogs could speak, they might remind us to be patient, loving, forgiving, and faithful. They would ask us to spend time with them, care for them when they are afraid, and stay beside them when they grow old. Their simple loyalty often teaches us lessons about love and trust.

In many ways, those same messages come to us every day—not from dogs, but from the people around us: our children, parents, spouses, friends, coworkers, and even strangers. Through their words and actions, God often speaks to us.

These are prophetic voices in our lives. When we listen to them with open hearts, we receive a prophet's reward. As we learn to listen, we also learn to speak words of encouragement, hope, and compassion.

And like the prophets before us, we become instruments through whom God's blessings and healing reach others.

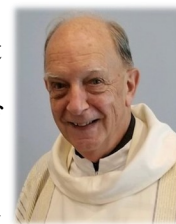
Prayer for Protection During a Storm

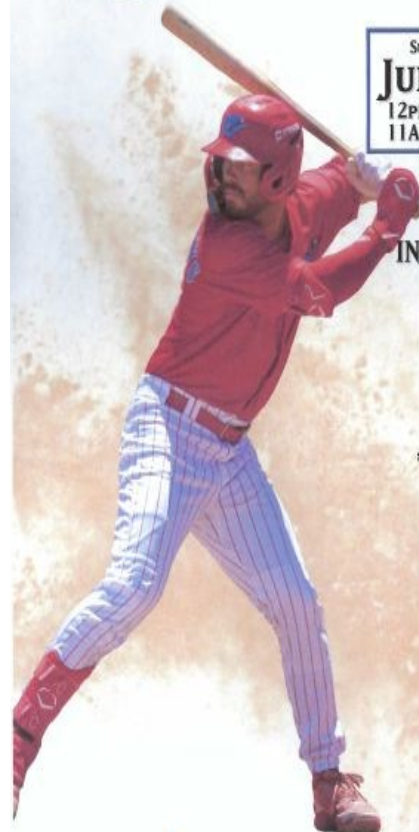
