St. Peter Julian Eymard: The Saint Who Leads Us to the Heart of Jesus

On August 2, the Church celebrates the feast of **St. Peter Julian Eymard (1811–1868)**, lovingly known as the "**Apostle of the Eucharist**." His life reminds us that the greatest treasure of the Church is the living presence of Jesus Christ in the Most Blessed Sacrament. Through his witness, we are invited to deepen our love for the Eucharist—the source and summit of the Christian life.

From an early age, Peter Julian Eymard was captivated by the Blessed Sacrament. While still a child, he often spent long hours praying before the tabernacle, convinced that Jesus was truly present there. This deep Eucharistic devotion shaped his entire life and vocation.

Despite poor health and family opposition, Eymard faithfully followed God's call to the priesthood. After serving as a diocesan priest and later as a member of the Marist Fathers, he discerned a new mission: to renew the Church by leading people back to Christ in the Eucharist. In 1856, he founded the **Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament**, dedicated to promoting the celebration of the Eucharist, frequent Holy Communion, and Eucharistic adoration. His conviction was simple yet profound: when people truly encounter Jesus in the Eucharist, their lives, families, and parishes are transformed.

At the heart of St. Eymard's spirituality is the mystery of the **Real Presence**. He taught that the Eucharist is not merely a sacred symbol but Jesus Christ Himself—His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity—remaining with His Church until the end of time. Every celebration of the Mass makes present Christ's one sacrifice on Calvary, and every tabernacle is a lasting sign of God's desire to remain among His people.

For St. Eymard, Eucharistic adoration naturally flows from the Holy Mass. In adoration we do not simply gaze upon the Blessed Sacrament; we allow Christ to gaze upon us. In His presence our hearts are healed, our faith is strengthened, and we are gradually transformed into His likeness. Time spent before the Eucharistic Lord is never wasted, for it teaches us to love as Christ loves and to serve as He serves.

His devotion to the Eucharist also inspired a life of charity. St. Eymard believed that authentic Eucharistic worship must bear fruit in compassion, forgiveness, reconciliation, and generous service. The Eucharist always sends us forth to become what we receive—the Body of Christ for the life of the world.

As members of **St. Vincent de Paul Parish**, whose mission is "**We Worship, Connect, Grow and Serve the Lord in the Eucharist**," we find in St. Eymard a powerful model of discipleship. He reminds us that every ministry, every act of charity, and every effort to build our parish community must begin and end at the altar. The Eucharist is the source of our worship, the bond of our unity, and the strength for our mission.

As we celebrate his feast day, may St. Peter Julian Eymard inspire us to love the Holy Mass more deeply, spend more time in Eucharistic adoration, and bring Christ's presence into our homes and our community. Through his intercession, may our hearts always echo his lifelong desire: that Jesus in the Eucharist may be known, loved, adored, and served by all.

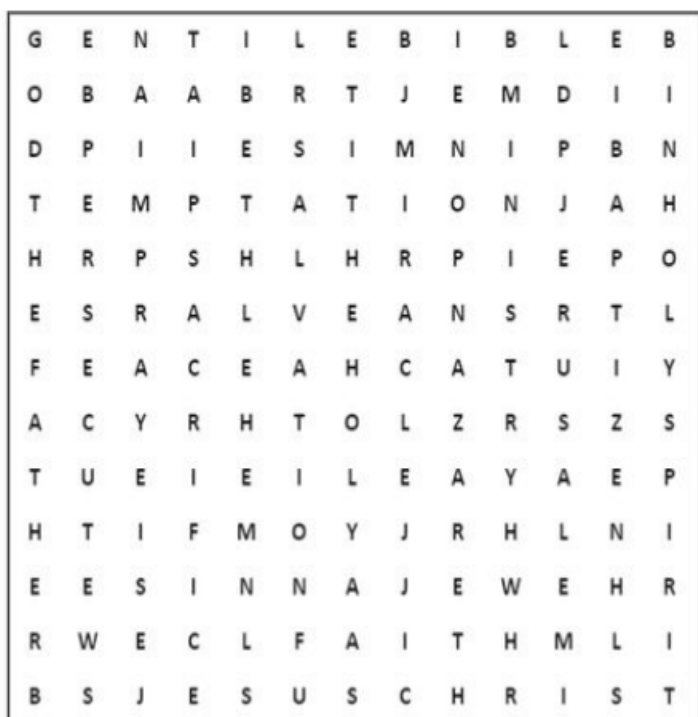

As mentioned in a previous bulletin, we will continue to share the suggested comments recorded during the Come, See & be Heard Meetings held during late Spring.

A topic we considered was the Music. The question presented was: Does the Music enhance your worship? The responses were: we need more choir members and more practice, possibly blend the choirs; keep the numbers displayed digitally; project both notes and words; consider adding instruments; update the hymns, more charismatic, uplifting music; and enhance the audio system by possibly hooking up with blue tooth.

Another topic discussed was: How satisfied are you with the opportunities for prayer and the sacraments? The comments were: adoration and holy hour should be in the evening once a month; do not like face to face reconciliation; wish adoration was online and live streamed; reconciliation times are not convenient and would like to see more availability for confession; advertise our adoration hours through the Diocese and stagger Mass times to coordinate with nearby parishes.
