GROWING IN GOD'S GRACE

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Believe it or not, the Church as a community, and as a family, has seen anxious and disturbing moments, as well as calm and consoling moments.

As it is with the Church, so it was with the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. And today's gospel gives us a glimpse of the turmoil and distress that they experienced as a family.

They are not a "no-worries be-happy" family without anxieties and difficulties. They were a real family, who faced real emergencies and life-threatening situations in their lives. Immediately, after the birth of Jesus, Mary and Joseph had to flee from their homeland to escape the death squads that were going after them.

Even though Jesus was the "Emmanuel", the "God-is-with-us" the Holy Family was not spared of the trauma and the danger of the chaos of life. Yet, for better or for worse, in good times or in bad, they stayed together.

Joseph did not abandon mother and child in the time of need. Mary did not abandon the child Jesus for her own safety. Their staying together in the face of trials showed us this truth- that God is with us when we are united.

So it is with the Holy Family, and so it will be with our families, so it will be with the Church community. Whether it is family or community, we need each other in order to become what God wants us to be.

There is this interesting story about porcupines. An extremely cold winter was coming and the porcupines had to find a way to survive.

At first they decided to group together to keep warm and protect one another. But unfortunately, their sharp spiky quills poked at each other as they huddled together, so they dispersed. Of course this left them exposed to the bitter cold and they started to freeze to the point of death.

So they had to make a fundamental life or death choice – either they stay apart and die, or they tolerate and accept each other's thorns and survive. And to think of it, we are a bit like porcupines.

We have our own "spiky quills" and with that we hurt others and others hurt us too. At times, living as members of the family and community can be so painful and hurtful, that we think it might be better off living alone. But if the porcupines know how to stay together in order to survive, then we must also learn to accept and live with the spiky quills of others.


The Church has suffered much from its own sharp quills. The Church has seen painful and hurtful times. But under the leadership of Popes, there is healing and restoration.

MARY MOTHER OF GOD A Mother to All

Mary, the mother of Jesus, is honored in Christian tradition as the **Mother of God**, a title formally defined by the Council of Ephesus in 431 AD.

This title, known in Greek as **Theotokos** (literally "God-bearer"), signifies that she gave birth to the person of Jesus Christ, who is both fully God and fully man.

The Church emphasizes that Mary did not create the divine nature of Jesus, which has existed for eternity. However, because mothers give birth to *persons* rather than just natures, and Jesus is one divine person, she is rightly called the Mother of God.

This major feast day is celebrated annually on **January 1**. It is a **Holy Day of Obligation in the Roman Catholic Church**, marking the end of the Octave of Christmas.

While the specific phrase "Mother of God" is not in the Bible, it is rooted in Luke 1:43, where Elizabeth refers to Mary as "the mother of my Lord". Other key passages include the Annunciation (Luke 1:26-38) and the Magnificat (Luke 1:46-55).

A Year With Fr. Eymard by Fr. Erasto Fernandez, S.S.S.

Dec. 28 : "Stay very close to our Lord and see his holy will in everything that happens." (To Mme Benoite Richard, May 1867)



Dec. 29 : "Live deeply within your own soul in our Lord, because that is your real home and your real life." (To Ms. Virginie Danion, February 1867)

Dec. 30 : "That's the reason for which I was unwilling to go merely with reparation... and a life exclusively contemplative. For us, we not only want to adore, serve and love Jesus in the Eucharist, but especially to make it known, adored, served and loved by every heart." (Fr. Eymard, 1867)

Dec. 31 : "Be the apostle of the divine Eucharist, like a flame which enlightens and warms, like the Angel of his heart who will go to proclaim him to those who don't know him and will encourage those who love him and care suffering." (To Mme Antoinette de Grandville, July, 1859)

January 1 : "The Society of the Blessed Sacrament is not satisfied with adoring, loving and serving the God of the Eucharist: its zeal for his glory desires to have him adored, loved and served by everyone, and to erect for him thrones of love and to gather faithful adorers for him. Jesus said: 'I have come to set fire on the earth; my only wish is to see this fire engulf the entire world' (Lk 12:49) " (Retreat on a Eucharistic vocation)

Jan. 2 : "Pray that we may become true disciples of the love of Jesus Christ in order to be one day worthy apostles." (To A. Adele de Revel de Nesc, May, 1856)

Jan. 3 : "The Eucharist is the reign of Jesus Christ in the world and especially in the hearts of his children: there you have the beautiful and attractive mission of every religious of the Most Blessed Sacrament; disciple and apostle of Eucharistic love: that is his true name, his grace and his life." (Retreat on a Eucharistic vocation)

Jan. 4 : "Find me from among your alumni a few men afire for this new Order" (To l'Abbe Bramerel, November 1854)


