WHAT IS TENACITY?

his Week

The strength to persist in the face of challenges, demonstrating resilience in pursuing one's goals and commitments.

It's like when we keep trying, even if we fall, because we know God wants us to do our best.

Tenacity is often a more significant factor in achieving success than innate talent.

Examples of Tenacity:

- A student is trying to learn a new math concept. At first, it's confusing and hard. But they keep practicing and asking questions, not giving up. After a lot of hard work, they finally understand the lesson.
- A runner who falls during a race but gets back up and finishes the race, even though it's painful. They don't let the fall stop them from finishing what they started.



WHAT IS BOLDNESS?

The strength to act decisively, standing up for one's beliefs, even in the face of opposition.

Boldness is being brave and speaking the truth, even when it's difficult. It's standing up for what's right because we trust in God.

Examples of Boldness:

- **1. Speaking Up in Class:** Encourage students to ask questions, share their opinions, or contribute to discussions, even if they feel unsure. They can prepare by thinking of a question or comment before class to build confidence.
- **2. Trying New Activities:** Encourage students to participate in extracurricular activities or clubs they haven't tried before. This could include joining a sports team, drama club, or a community service project, helping them step out of their comfort zones.




