WHAT IS LOVE FOR NEIGHBOR?

The virtue of Love for Neighbor, or Charity, is a divinely infused virtue, that gives us the strength to love God above all things for His own sake, and our neighbor as ourselves for the love of God.

Love for neighbor means being kind and caring to everyone, just like Jesus taught us. It's about sharing, helping, and being a friend to those in need.

Examples of Love for Neighbor:

- 1. Smiling at others as you greet them.
- 2. Speaking positively of others and avoiding negative comments in person, online, behind their back, etc.
- 3. Looking for opportunities to serve or help others.
- 4. Sharing what you have with others.



WHAT IS FORGIVENESS?

The strength to release resentment and pardon others for their wrongdoings.

Forgiveness means letting go of hurt and saying "I forgive you" when someone does something wrong. It helps us heal and grow in love, just like Jesus forgives us.

Sample Steps of Forgiveness:

1. STOP & CALM DOWN

- Before you react, take a deep breath and calm your heart.

2. TALK TO GOD & EXPRESS YOUR FEELINGS

- Pray and tell God how you feel. It's okay to feel sad, angry, or upset.

3. CHOOSE TO FORGIVE

- Forgiveness is a choice, not a feeling. You might not feel ready, but you can still decide to let go of the hurt.

4. MOVE FORWARD WITH LOVE

- If possible, be kind and try to make peace with the person who hurt you.








Third Grade is learning about pollination! We learned how to move pollen in plants so the plants produce seeds!










Third Grade experimented with food to find out if the food was a science fruit or a science vegetable.




