Please label all uniform fleeces and sweatshirts to help us manage our Lost and Found and get these items back to their owners!



WHAT IS FORGIVENESS?

his week The strength to release resentment and pardon others for their wrongdoings.

Forgiveness means letting go of hurt and saying "I forgive you" when someone does something wrong. It helps us heal and grow in love, just like Jesus forgives us.

Sample Steps of Forgiveness:

1. STOP & CALM DOWN

- Before you react, take a deep breath and calm your heart.

2. TALK TO GOD & EXPRESS YOUR FEELINGS

- Pray and tell God how you feel. It's okay to feel sad, angry, or upset.

3. CHOOSE TO FORGIVE

- Forgiveness is a choice, not a feeling. You might not feel ready, but you can still decide to let go of the hurt.

4. MOVE FORWARD WITH LOVE

- If possible, be kind and try to make peace with the person who hurt you.

The strength to recognize and value the good in others and in life's experiences.

Appreciation means being thankful for all the good things God gives us, like family, friends, and the beauty of the world.

It's about saying "thank you" and recognizing blessings.


Phrases to help remind students to be appreciative:








Celebrating our Veterans on Tuesday,





Dr. Andrew and Sarah Swafford speak frequently across the country on dating, marriage, the moral and spiritual life, St. John Paul II, and Sacred Scripture. Together, they are the authors of the award-winning Gift and Grit: How Heroic Virtue Can Change Your Life and Relationships and co hosts of Ascension's What We Believe: The Beauty of the Catholic Faith, filmed at 30 holy sites in Rome, a series which received two Telly awards. Sarah is the author of Emotional Virtue: A Guide to Drama-free Relationships and co host of EWTN's At the Heart of Relationships. She is also a contributor to Ascension's Chosen. Andrew is Professor of Theology at Benedictine College and author of A Catholic Guide to the Old Testament, What We Believe: The Beauty of the Catholic Faith, and Spiritual Survival in the Modern World: Insights from C.S. Lewis' Screwtape Letters. He is also general editor of Ascension's Great Adventure Catholic Bible and host of Ascension's Bible studies on Romans and Hebrews, which also won a Telly award. Andrew and Sarah live in Atchison, KS with their six children.
