VIRTUE=STRENGTH.

WHAT IS TEMPERANCE?

The virtue of Temperance, or Moderation, is the strength that moderates the attraction of pleasures and provides balance in the use of created goods.

Practicing temperance leads to self-discipline, respect for others, and a more balanced life. It helps us live according to God's will rather than being ruled by impulses.

Phrases to Remind Us to Practice Temperance:

1. "Balance is key in all things."
2. "Less is more; quality over quantity."
3. "Think before you act."
4. "True happiness comes from moderation, not excess."
5. "Self-control today leads to strength tomorrow."

VIRTUE=STRENGTH.

WHAT IS SINCERITY?

The strength to express thoughts and feelings honestly and openly.

A sincere person communicates truthfully and acts with integrity, fostering trust and meaningful relationships.

Examples of Sincerity:

1. Genuinely apologizing when we've made a mistake or hurt someone's feelings. An authentic apology involves acknowledging what we did wrong, expressing remorse, and making amends, rather than just saying, "I'm sorry" without meaning it.
2. Giving compliments that are heartfelt and specific, rather than generic praise. For example, instead of saying, "Great job," we could say, "I really liked how you explained your project; it made it easy to understand."
3. Being sincere about our efforts in schoolwork and extracurricular activities. For instance, if we are struggling with a subject, we should feel comfortable admitting it and seeking help rather than pretending everything is fine to avoid judgment.
