WHAT IS TEMPERANCE?

The virtue of Temperance, or Moderation, is the strength that moderates the attraction of pleasures and provides balance in the use of created goods.

Practicing temperance leads to self-discipline, respect for others, and a more balanced life. It helps us live according to God's will rather than being ruled by impulses.

Phrases to Remind Us to Practice Temperance:

- 1. "Balance is key in all things."
- 2. "Less is more; quality over quantity."
- 3. "Think before you act."
- 4. "True happiness comes from moderation, not excess."
- 5. "Self-control today leads to strength tomorrow."



WHAT IS CLEMENCY?

The strength to show mercy and understanding towards others, particularly in the context of their failings or mistakes.

Clemency is about giving second chances, just like God is gentle and merciful with us.

Examples of Clemency:

- 1. Pope St. Leo I (Leo the Great, 440-461): Pope Leo I is known for his diplomacy and clemency, particularly in his dealings with the Huns. In 452, he met with Attila the Hun and successfully persuaded him not to invade Rome. Leo's approach combined firmness with mercy, aiming to preserve peace without violence.
- 2. Pope St. John Paul II (1978-2005): Pope John Paul II visited his would-be assassin, Mehmet Ali Ağca, in 1983, where he forgave him for the assassination attempt. His commitment to peace and reconciliation was a hallmark of his papacy, emphasizing the need for mercy in the face of violence and conflict.




