THE MISSION OF ST. PATRICK SCHOOL is to foster the spiritual growth and academic life of its students, faculty, and staff, and to teach children, with the cooperation of parents, a Catholic way of life.

The **50th Annual Tazewell County Right to Life Baby Food Project** in conjunction with St. Patrick School was a tremendous success, providing close to \$7,000 in baby formula and food to mothers and babies in need.

The St. Patrick School Seventh Grade class organized the collection of baby food and formula from their fellow students. Additional formula and baby food was purchased with donations from 5 parishes, including St. Patrick Church Washington, the Msgr. E.L. Grzybowski Knights of Columbus, and the Mary T. Quinn Division, Tazewell County Ladies Ancient Order of Hibernians.

A <u>total of \$6998</u> worth of baby formula and food was delivered on March 31, 2023 with the assistance of the 7th grade class. These products were delivered to three social service agencies: St. Gianna Baby Pantry of Catholic Charities, Empower Life Center, and the Women's Care Center.

The students were accompanied by Mrs. Chris Kapraun, their homeroom teacher, and representatives of Tazewell County Right to Life Kay Grillot and Kitty Yontz.

The students' field trip began with an appointment with US Representative Darin LaHood in his Peoria office to thank him for his pro-life stance and encourage his continuing pro-life votes.
