A Message From Our Pastor

Are We Preparing a Place or Keeping Him Outside?

A few years ago, a family prepared their house for a very special guest. They cleaned the front room, arranged the sofa, and even placed fresh flowers on the table. Everything looked perfect. But when the guest arrived and asked gently, "May I wash my hands?" there was an awkward silence. The bathroom was messy, the water tap was broken, and the door was quickly shut. The guest was welcomed but only to a certain extent. That simple moment reveals something very human. We like to welcome people where it is comfortable and hide the places that feel unfinished, broken, or embarrassing. Today's question touches that same reality of the heart: are we preparing a place for Jesus or are we welcoming him only to the front room of our lives while quietly keeping some doors closed? Jesus once said, In my Father's house there are many dwelling places... I go to prepare a place for you. Think about that, Jesus prepares a place for us in heaven, while here on earth, he asks us to prepare a place for him in our hearts. The problem is not that we have no space. The problem is that our hearts are already occupied. Many of us are busy people. Our hearts are filled with schedules, worries, ambitions, resentments, and distractions. None of these are evil by themselves. But when they take first place, Jesus is left waiting at the door. We say we believe, we attend Mass, we pray but deep inside, Jesus becomes a visitor, not a resident. Look at the story of Bethlehem. There was no room for Jesus in the inn. It was not because people were cruel. It was because they were busy. The rooms were full. And so the Savior of the world was placed in a manger. Even today, Jesus is often pushed to the margins of our lives not rejected, just postponed. Preparing a place for Jesus does not mean doing extraordinary things. It means making intentional choices. It means forgiving when it is easier to hold a grudge. It means choosing honesty when lying feels convenient. It means turning off the noise so we can hear his voice. Like clearing space in a crowded room, it may feel uncomfortable at first, but it creates peace. Sometimes we fear that if we truly let Jesus in, he will demand too much. But Jesus does not enter to take away our joy; he enters to give us deeper joy. He does not come to condemn; he comes to heal. When Jesus enters a heart, he brings light—and light always reveals what needs cleaning, not to shame us, but to free us. Think of a child who runs home after making a mistake. A loving home is not a courtroom; it is a place of safety. In the same way, our hearts are meant to be a safe place for Jesus—not perfect, but honest. So dear friends today, let us examine ourselves gently. Are we preparing a place for the Lord through prayer, humility, and love? Or are we keeping him outside with excuses, fear, and delay? Jesus is not far away. He is near, waiting patiently. All he asks is a place not a palace, just a heart willing to open. May we not be too busy, too afraid, or too distracted to make room for the One who has already made room for us in his heart.


ADVENT PRAYER BY HENRI NOUWEN
