# **OVERVIEW**

Survivor Advocates for Empowerment ("SAFE" or the "organization") is a survivor-led organization with a focus on supporting and advocating for survivors of gender-based violence.

The SAFE Committee is the heart and soul of SAFE. The Committee is made up of female-identified and non-binary survivors who are no longer in crisis. Their core focus is to provide support and services for survivors and their family members, educating the community through advocacy efforts and speaking engagements, and providing community consultations to organizations who service survivors.

SAFE began in the Halton region but has been slowly growing to provide services through as much of Ontario as possible. At this time, SAFE's main focus is on the Halton region, Hamilton and surrounding areas, and the Greater Toronto Area.

SAFE was incorporated on August 7, 2023 under the federal *Not-For-Profit Corporations Act*, SC 2009, c. 23. In our infancy stages, several activities are taking place to operationalize the Corporation. Tasks include but are not limited to: applying for charitable status, establishing by-laws and governance policies for the Corporation, recruiting Board members, and building out a fundraising schedule. All these initiatives are concurrently occurring as the SAFE team continues to support survivors at a grassroots level.

## **PURPOSE**

SAFE's mission is to address and prevent specific barriers faced by victims and survivors of gender-based violence, their families, and their friends by providing:

- 1. Peer support, discussion groups, outreach programs, and workshops catered to the specific needs of survivors, as identified by survivors.
- 2. Educational programs to and consulting with community organizations about gender-based violence from the perspective of survivors with lived experience.

# **HOW SAFE SUPPORTS**

SAFE's role is to assist survivors.

- SAFE acts as a companion and guide in helping individuals understand their options at whichever point they are at in their journey to safety and security.
- SAFE's survivor-led support model is rooted in providing 100% peer support through the entire process.
- SAFE will engage in community advocacy for survivors for the purpose of increasing awareness and improving existing services through peer support utilizing the survivor's voice.
- SAFE provides public education opportunities for survivors to identify violence and move towards recovery; and opportunities for non-survivors to understand violence and support the movement towards eradicating gender-based violence.

# WHO SAFE SUPPORTS



#### Victims and Survivors

Female-identified, non-binary individuals who have experienced gender-based violence (GBV) or intimate partner violence (IPV).

SAFE supports these individuals to prevent them from before, during and after experiencing abuse.



## Support Agencies and Law Enforcement

Professional agencies and police providing professional services to victims and survivors.

SAFE provides a survivor's voice in each step of engagement.



#### **Community and Government**

General public and government representatives.

SAFE organizes events to educate the public to recognize GBV and IPV, how to support those in need, and how we can work together to prevent it. SAFE also advocates for survivors to government representatives at all levels.

## **Message from the Board of Directors**

Thank you for taking the time to learn more about our organization. SAFE started off as a very small, Halton-based committee of survivors of gender-based violence. We have spent years volunteering any extra time we may have towards a common purpose: to provide survivor-centric support to folks in our community experiencing abuse, leaving an abusive situation, and recovering from the aftermath of violence. We have sought to fill a gap in our community; namely, the lack of awareness of gender-based violence and the fear, isolation, hopelessness, and uncertainty that comes from that. Adequate, culturally sensitive resources are minimal, and where they are plentiful, they are overwhelmingly so for someone who is on the path to recovery from trauma. That is where we come in.

SAFE provides peer support and we are uniquely situated to do so. We are intimately aware of the widespread impacts of gender-based violence from our own lived and shared experiences. We help survivors navigate the complexities of accessing resources and seeking help, and we teach survivors that recovery is possible. We do all of this from a compassionate and intersections lens, all the while amplifying the survivor's voice in our community through educational workshops, consultation with local organizations, and appearing as delegations before local governments.

After years of grassroots organizing on a small level, SAFE is proud to be growing and extending our reach. Your donation helps us do that. With your support, SAFE will be able to launch our own programs and workshops to support survivors across Ontario. We will be able to expand our services to provide more effective peer support and extend our consultative work and lobbying efforts.
