Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Hello Friends,

Thank you to everyone who made the 2025 Vacation Bible School week a great and joyful experience! We also thank the Lord for bringing us together and giving us good summer weather. Thank you to everyone who assisted us (this year) in improving the Banquet Hall (such as new lights, new paint and remodeled bathrooms). This gathering space is now better than ever! The VBS students were happy and they were engaged with the positive message of "Trust Jesus!" They learned that practicing the faith together can be joyful and fun. Thank you to our wonderful and amazing leaders and volunteers who do great things for the children and for the community! And thank you to everyone for supporting the Blessed Carlo Acutis statue fund! We are looking forward to honoring this soon-to-be saint!

There is a theme in the readings this weekend that is near and dear to all of our hearts: prayer.

As we know, there are many Catholic prayers and many ways of praying. Jesus gave us a prayer to always rely on: The Our Father. The Our Father prayer is an affirmation that God is love, that God hears, and that God is in charge. But the prayer also reminds us that we have responsibilities ("...as we forgive those who trespass against us.") In prayer, give your heart to God, but also be mindful of what you can do that will be pleasing to God. Remember, when you pray the Our Father you are praying for everyone in God's family (especially those who need help the most).

Jesus also emphasized the importance of being persistent in prayer. There are many reasons for this. Recall Jesus' own life. When he could have been doing something else (gaining converts; or healing people; or multiplying food,) he chose to interrupt his usual work for personal time in prayer. Prayer is not selfish if it is oriented to the greater good. Prayer is spiritual work. Jesus was setting the example that without it we'd we be lacking something vital and important. We cannot thrive on our own. We need grace and help from Heaven. Praying regularly, in a humble yet confident way, consecrates the person to God. For those of us consecrated by the Church (priests and religious), we know that it was prayer, our regularly scheduled prayer (in seminary or the convent) and the extra prayer that we did everyday whether it was in the chapel or outside or in the privacy of our own room, that shaped us into the spiritually oriented people we became. Prayer keeps us focused and grounded. As the students learned during VBS, "If you keep Jesus close to you, in prayer, and receiving the Sacraments, you are never alone."



This weekend, we also have the example of Abraham famously "negotiating" (Abraham talked to God in many ways) with God. Abraham was attempting to save people who were otherwise deserving of God's wrath. "Please", said Abraham to God, "Let not my Lord grow angry if I speak up this last time. What if there are at least ten (good) people there?" Abraham was being clever and compassionate looking for a way to "save" as many people as could, wayward people who did not have a good relationship with God. Sometimes, we pray like Abraham, knowing our prayers might be their only spiritual hope. "For the sake of the ten, I will not destroy it", said the Lord about the

sinful cities. All of this was a credit to Abraham and it is an allegory for any one of us who step up to pray for others. The lesson: see the good even when the good is nearly overwhelmed by the bad and pray that through the grace of God, many people may be saved. Keep your prayer life active for yourself and for others!






