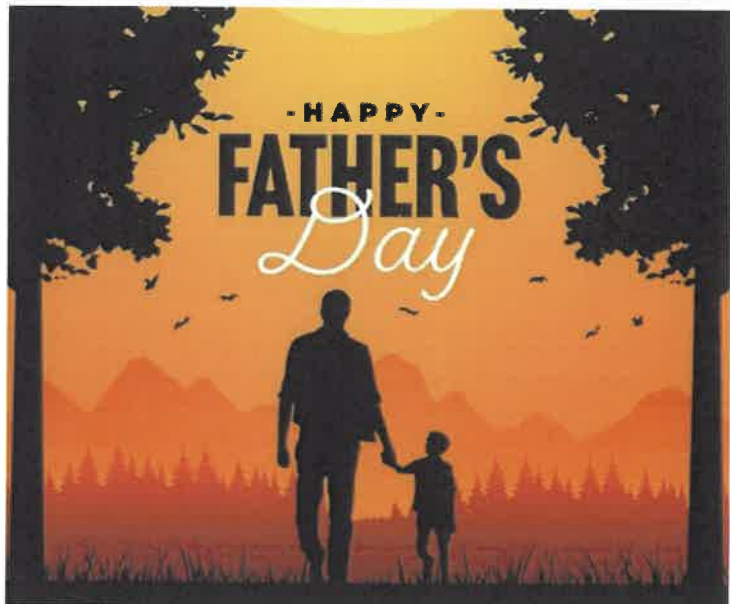

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Hello Friends,

Happy Father's Day to all the fathers and grandfathers and blessings to all the men and boys! May you continue to grow in your vocations and be the best Catholic men you can be. A healthy, positive and inspiring male role-model can make a life-long difference for us. Guys, may you be blessed and be a source of blessings!

You will notice that there will be no daily Masses at most of our local parishes until Friday. Keep the priests and Bishop Thomas in prayer this week as we will have our bi-annual Convocation at Sawmill Creek. It's a time for conference, prayer, and fraternity. Thanks again for your prayers.

Also, we are grateful for Seminarian Derek's presence and contributions. His time here will be short but also impactful. (Maybe you will see him at the Putnam County Fair this week!) Below is some of the research I asked him to share with us about Pope Leo's recent pilgrimage to Spain. Please come to Seminarian Derek's Camino presentations this week (see bulletin for details!) —Fr. George Mahas—

Pope Leo's Trip to Spain. On June 6th, Pope Leo XIV arrived in Madrid, the capital of Spain. This is the first time that the pope has visited Spain since Pope Benedict visited the country in 2011. During the trip, Pope Leo met with government and church officials, as well as the lay faithful and the poor.

At a prayer service in Madrid, the Holy Father spoke to over 600,000 young people. Pope Leo told the crowd, "You can change history — do it with love." The pope also encouraged young people to pursue their vocations, stating "Never be afraid of having a vocation for priestly life or religious life" and stated that "You don't have to be afraid to get married and start a family."

On June 8th, Pope Leo became the first pope to address the Spanish parliament. The Holy Father noted that Spain "has recognized the human being as a creature open to truth, endowed with freedom, and driven by a thirst for eternity that no temporal reality can quench." He urged the Spanish government to care for "the unborn child, the elderly, the sick, those who suffer in silence, or those who depend entirely on the care of others". The pope also stated that "Every human life must be recognized and safeguarded from conception to its natural end, in every circumstance of its existence." Pope Leo also praised the family. He describes the family as "the first school of humanity, where one learns, before anywhere else, the basic grammar of living together: welcoming life, caring for others, forgiving, serving and belonging."



Pope Leo left Madrid and traveled to Barcelona. He celebrated Mass at the Basilica of Sagrada Familia (see pic). This church began construction in 1882 and is still under construction! In his homily, Pope Leo noted that "The Basilica of the Sagrada Familia remains a work in progress today, reminding us that the Christian life is always a journey, because it is a project that God is carrying out." After the Mass, the pontiff consecrated the basilica's recently completed Tower of Jesus. Standing 566 feet tall, this tower makes the basilica the tallest church in the world. Venerable Antoni Gaudi designed the basilica and worked on it for over 40 years.

Pope Leo then traveled to the Canary Islands, where he met with migrants from Africa. The pope condemned the criminal networks that take advantage of migrants and called for "serious processes of welcome and integration, and policies that allow each person to live with dignity in his or her own land."

As Pope Leo was about to return to Rome, his plane had engine troubles. This required the pope and his entourage to disembark. The king of Spain, Felipe VI came to the rescue, providing his personal plane to the pope, which allowed him to return to Rome. —Seminarian Derek—

Amen.

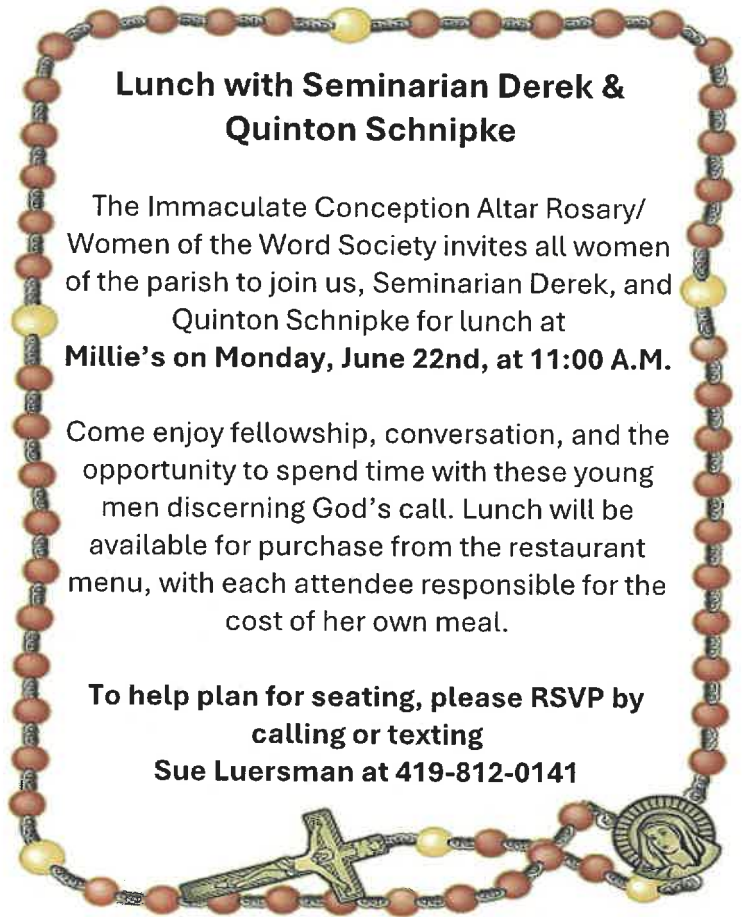


Lunch with Seminarian Derek & Quinton Schnipke

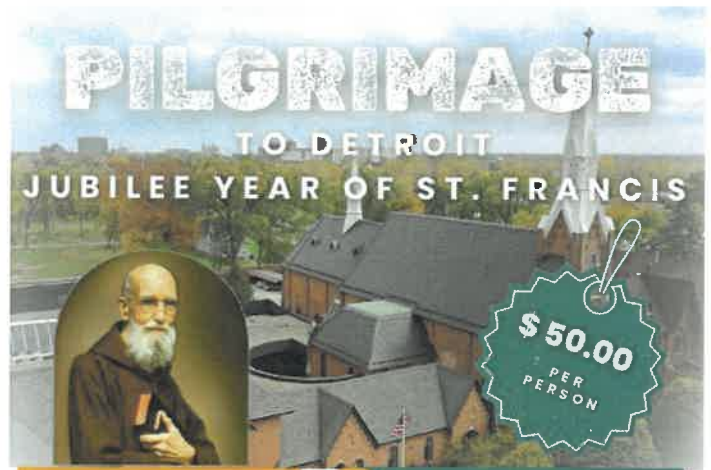
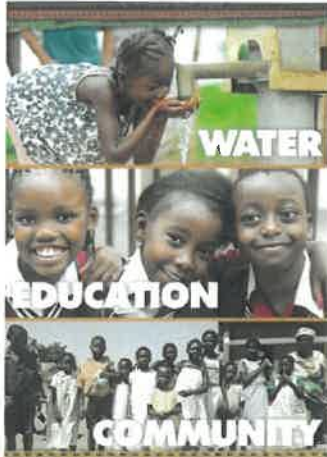


Thank you from Little Dresses for Africa
