

A Special Celebration for the Solemnity of Corpus Christi

We are joyfully announcing the first use of a new Chalice during Mass this Sunday, June 22nd, as we celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. This sacred and beautifully crafted vessel was generously gifted through the support and efforts of our 2024 Vacation Bible School. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to all who made this meaningful gift possible.

Handcrafted in Molina, Spain, the Chalice is engraved at its base with the following sacred images:

- The Sacred Heart of Jesus
- The Immaculate Heart of Mary
 - Saint Matthew
 - Saint Mark
 - Saint Luke
 - Saint John

Also inscribed on the Chalice are the words:

"Calicem Salutaris Accipiam Et Nomen Domini Invocabo"

("I will take the saving cup and call on the name of the Lord.")

This cherished addition to our liturgical life serves as a beautiful reminder of the sacredness of the Eucharist and the enduring presence of Christ in our midst.



Solemnity of Corpus Christi

Hello Friends,

This weekend, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Corpus Christi (also known as the Solemnity of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ). This celebration dates back to the 13th century during a time when mystics were encouraging greater Catholic devotion to the Sacrament.

Eucharistic devotion has a long history. Within our community, many of the elders can remember a traditional parish practice called "Forty Hours". Parishioners were asked to take turns and keep vigil before the Blessed Sacrament as it was exposed in the monstrance during public adoration. Priests would be available for Confessions and the priests would also have the opportunity to have some rare fraternal time together. (Some occasional raucous meals and card-playing took place in the rectories because it was also a time for priests to cut loose a bit!) Sometimes, an outdoor Eucharistic Procession would also be a part of the communal celebration. Eucharistic processions still occasionally take place, but we also know that American lifestyles have evolved, and it's difficult to expect everyone to participate in traditional Catholic devotions as they were formerly practiced. Still, the Eucharist can bring us together. Catholics are asked to make the Eucharist a weekly priority. For many of us, this is easy; but for some among us the commitment can be a challenge. An examination of conscience for a Catholic who is not participating in weekly Mass is the following: "Am I choosing other activities over the Eucharist? Is that a good idea? How has *not* practicing my faith actually helped me? Has it?" Sometimes we Catholics have a "wake-up" call to do better. Jesus is The Good Shepherd, and there are plenty of ways that he welcomes us back.

A traditional definition of a Catholic Sacrament is: "An outward sign of an invisible grace." Under the appearance of bread and wine, Holy Communion is the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus. And grace is certainly available through this Sacrament. Grace is God's help and love. (There are different kinds of grace such as "sanctifying" and "actual" and some teaching also identifies "sacramental" and "particular" grace.) St. Augustine stated: "Grace alone conquers sin" and "Grace helps good people not to escape their sufferings, but to bear them with a stout heart, with a spirit of fortitude". This is why those who struggle with particular sins such as anger, lust, envy, greed, or afflictions such as grief or anxiety receive Sacraments for the spiritual help. Whether or not we instantly "feel better," be assured that God's grace helps us. Be patient for grace to "work". God can help us in ways that no one else can.



How can you grow in your devotion to the Eucharist? Here are five suggestions:

1) Daily think about the life of Jesus as depicted in the Gospels. Think about him as a real person and as you would think about someone who is important in your life. This "puts" Jesus in your life every day. 2) Be thankful to God for something every day. Be intentional about it and remember that Eucharist means "thanksgiving". Thankful people are more easily drawn to Holy Communion. 3) Do something extra as a Catholic. Catholic devotions or acts of charity will lead to a deeper commitment to the Eucharist.

4) Begin to experience the church (any Catholic Church) as a place to spend extra and intentional time. The Eucharistic Lord is in the tabernacle. Sometimes we feel Jesus' presence differently when there are not as many people around. 5) At mass, do personal prayers as you wait your turn to receive Holy Communion. Be reverent, respectful and happy and grateful as you prepare to receive the Sacrament of Salvation.

Their behind-the-scenes work often goes unnoticed, but it plays a vital role in keeping our environment comfortable and functional for everyone.






