Hello Friends,

Congratulations to all of the Putnam County Fair students and their families for another successful year with their animals and projects! Great job keeping your animals cool and comfortable!

Occasional extreme heat is what we expect every summer. We pray for the health and well-being of everyone who works outside. There are a couple of saints who can help us out during this time of year. St. Bartholemew the Apostle for helping with our sunburns (he is an intercessor for skin afflictions) and St. Medard (who is popular in Florida) is an intercessor for those exposed to weather extremes, including heatwaves!

Of course, our major summer celebration is just around the corner. The 4th of July party started early with some local fireworks. Safety first! Enjoy the upcoming holiday!

It's a special time for our nation. If you've been following the national news you know that this summer marks the 250th Anniversary of the Battle of Bunker Hill (near Boston). (We also celebrated the 250th Anniversary of the U.S. Army.) For anyone who enjoys American history this year and next will be a great opportunity for learning. Next year we'll celebrate the Semiquincentennial of America with our 250th Anniversary! Of course, the major destinations for tourists will be to places like Philadelphia and Boston and perhaps even other historic cities such as Savannah, places with American Revolution roots. For all of us it'll be a good time to reflect on the meaning of being an American. Our history as Catholic Americans is unique. Most of us, with our later immigrant roots, were not part of "Founding Fathers and Mothers" and "Pilgrims" of the Mayflower or the patriots of the Revolution or the War of 1812. Quite to the contrary. In the early years (with some exceptions) we would not have been welcomed in those early New England settlements! (For generations, anti-Catholicism ran deep in the Colonies.) But we Catholics found a way to both be true to our Catholic faith and to integrate as Americans. Everyone has their role in history.



But, locally, we do have a special connection to the American Revolution. Israel Putnam was a leader of the Battle of Bunker Hill. So many of our first soldiers were citizen soldiers, leaving home for battle only when necessary. Putnam, whom our Putnam County is named after, was a citizen soldier of high rank having experience in previous wars. When tension rose in 1775, he famously abandoned his plow, and rode at top speed from his home in Connecticut to the Boston area and helped take charge of what became known as The Battle of Bunker Hill. Putnam, aka "Old Put", distinguished himself by keeping the citizen

soldiers occupied and alert and ready (including taunting the British). Although the Battle of Bunker Hill was technically a victory for the British it was at great cost to them; and it proved that Americans were serious and were "in-it to win-it". So, we remember our namesake and we remember the story of our country this week!

Summer is also the time some of us travel. It is that time of year when I will be heading down South (Southeast Georgia) to see my family. Thank you in advance for the prayers! We also thank Fr. John and Fr. Steve for celebrating the masses during this first part of July. In family news, my mom and my brother Michael recently rescued three little kittens; it was a secret rescue, because that puts them over the quota for pets in the house. We'll see how it goes! We hope you enjoy the results of this dedicated team's effort!














Vacation Bible School—Donation Instructions
