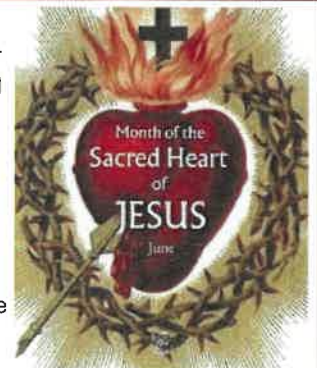

## Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Hello Friends,

*“Humanity, created by God in all its grandeur, is today facing a pivotal choice: either to construct a new Tower of Babel or to build the city in which God and humanity dwell together. Each generation inherits the task of shaping its own era, of guiding history to become a place where the dignity of every person is safeguarded, justice is promoted and fraternity is made possible. Yet every era also runs the risk of creating an inhumane and more unjust world. Whenever humanity is in danger of marring its true identity, we Christians lift our eyes to the Incarnate God, knowing that it is “only in the mystery of the Word made flesh that the mystery of humanity truly becomes clear.” In Jesus Christ, this humanity in its grandeur becomes the Way, the Truth and the Life, opening the path for each of us to grow toward fullness.” Pope Leo XVI, Magnifica Humanitas.*

This month, Pope Leo XVI issued his first papal encyclical and he made international headlines by addressing both the phenomenon of “artificial intelligence” and the Catholic Church’s teaching about the human dignity of all. This is an issue near and dear to Pope Leo’s heart. There has been no world leader (spiritual or political) who has addressed the issue so pointedly as Pope Leo XVI. Most likely, it’s a great reason the Holy Spirit led him both to the papacy to take the name “Leo” (his 19<sup>th</sup> century predecessor Leo XIII, confronted the industrial exploitation of people and expressed the need for us Catholics to utilize our social teachings to advocate for the dignity of all life). You may have seen a clip of Pope Leo saying in the clearest English a pope has ever spoken: “Artificial Intelligence needs to be disarmed. The word is strong I know, but deliberately chosen, because this moment needs words capable of attracting attention, awakening consciences, and indicating paths forwards.”

The encyclical (the highest teaching document issued by popes) warns against (AI) human exploitation and destruction (particularly due to modern warfare technologies) and the reduction of the person to being measured as simply a unit of consumption and or simply a “number” and not a person created in the image and likeness of God with a God given dignity from beginning to end of life. Sadly, as some of us have experienced, people can be reduced to “necessary” or “unnecessary” persons (or units!) depending on what or who judges our worth and merit to receive services (some of us have experienced this after being rejected from certain life improving or sustaining medical or social services). Pope Leo sees the stakes as being immeasurably high and warns that if we are not careful, those who are not valued within an amoral (and maybe immoral) AI paradigm may be existentially or even literally (especially through modern AI warfare) annihilated in a 21<sup>st</sup> Century holocaust. These are extreme possibilities, but the pope is taking no chances and is speaking out now.



So, what’s the answer? We must put our faith into action. Religion, in particular the Catholic social teachings, can serve to protect and defend life (like the Catholic pro-life movement) during a time of social paradigm shifts. Our faith is not just for our personal edification or personal salvation. We are our each other’s “keepers”, and what we do for the least, will be done to us. We are accountable to God. One of the Gifts of the Holy Spirit is Fear of the Lord. We have the responsibility to protect life and creation and not be indifferent to it or destroy it or stand by as both are being destroyed (Pope Francis issued an encyclical, *Laudato Si*, to encourage protection of “our common home”). At the presentation of the pope’s document, there was even a self-identified atheist, the founder of the AI company Anthropic, the 33-year-old billionaire Chris Olah. He said that it is the responsibility and role of organized religions to speak up and use all of its influence to protect humanity from the possible destructive forces of AI. We will no doubt hear our pope continuously advocate for the protections of all persons during this new modern era of AI. –Fr. George Mahas—

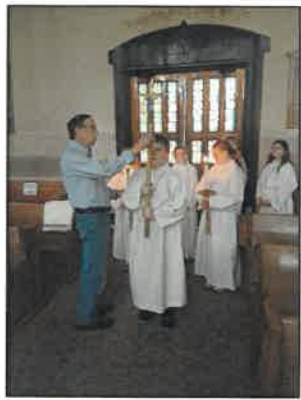
