Your Pre-Trip Inspection - A Critical Reminder

We cannot stress this enough: your pre-trip inspection is essential to safety and success.

While we believe everyone is doing a great job in this area and making good use of EBO, we want to take a moment to share a few important reminders:

- Do NOT hook up to a trailer unless the door is fully closed.
- NEVER pull away from a dock without checking the trailer and verifying it's safe to do so.
- ALWAYS inspect before you connect no exceptions.

Safety starts with each of us. Thank you for staying sharp and continuing to do things the right way, every time.

How to Prevent Drowsy Driving:

Prioritize sleep: Aim for 7-9 hours of sleep per day/night shift for optimal alertness.

Maintain a consistent sleep schedule: Stick to a regular sleep-wake pattern, even on weekends.

Avoid driving when tired: If you're feeling sleepy, pull over to a safe location for a rest or nap.

Don't rely on stimulants: Caffeine can provide a temporary boost, but it's not a long-term solution and can create a false sense of alertness.

Be aware of warning signs: Recognize the signs of drowsiness, such as frequent yawning, difficulty focusing, and drifting from your lane.

Brake Safety Awareness Month

August is Brake Safety Awareness Month, with the Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance (CVSA) holding its Brake Safety Week from August 24-30, 2025.

Brake system and adjustment violations are the most common issues found during roadside inspections, according to CDLjobs.com.

FMCSA data shows braking deficiencies are the most frequent inspection violations.

Drivers should carefully inspect their own braking systems to avoid being sidelined.

Increased Level IV brake inspections can be expected during this safety week.



Please be advised that your airlines are not to touch the fuel tank or the front fender. This practice is unsafe and violates DOT regulations.

Kindly adjust your airlines accordingly to ensure compliance and safety.

This is a reminder that under no circumstances should mud flaps be removed from other tractors. If you need mud flaps, please contact Dell to obtain them.

Additionally, please store mud flaps on the catwalk or inside the truck when moving pups. This practice helps prevent damage to the mud flaps during pulling operations and ensures they are not destroyed. Mud flaps must be properly installed on tractors when pulling 53-foot trailers.



HEALTHY TIP

Driving in challenging summer conditions

Stay hydrated: Drink plenty of water throughout the day, even if not thirsty, to prevent dehydration.

Take breaks: Regularly take breaks to cool down and rest in shaded or airconditioned areas.

Watch for construction zones: Plan routes to avoid peak traffic in construction areas, and be extra cautious as roadwork is more common in the summer.

Be patient with increased traffic: Summer often brings more travelers to the roads, necessitating increased patience and awareness.

Use extra caution in work zones: Be alert for sudden stops, reduced speed limits, workers, and equipment.

Be alert for pedestrians, cyclists, and bikers: Pay close attention, especially in urban areas and recreation spots.


