Message from Fr. Tony Hesse:

This past week I visited with a parishioner and then our conversation was re-enforced that evening at our Evangelization & Catechesis meeting. At both times, we were discussing the need for helpers. We were sharing how we need people to help with chairing our Fall Festivals and getting involved with being catechists for our Faith Formation. This made me think about Stewardship.

As I reflect on our society, many people want to help, but they do not want to commit themselves – just in case something better comes up. However, if the day comes, and they are free, sure they will help. However, that does not help us plan events. It is hard to plan events when we don't know if anyone will come. And to "Build it and they will come" does not always work.

Again, I know we are all busy, but sadly this word busy is becoming a swear word. As our retreat director at our priests' retreat last Spring said, "BUSY" is an acronym for **B**eing **U**nder **S**atan's **Y**oke. Basically, what he is saying is that we are busy doing different things pulling ourselves away from our Lord, becoming more like Martha, rather than being more like Mary and doing the better part? Are we "Busy" doing other things, rather than what God wants? Where is God and His

Church on our list of priorities? As I shared several weeks ago in my homily, we know what our priorities are by looking at our calendars and schedule books. Is God anywhere on them?

Now, don't get me wrong, I am not trying to make anyone feel guilty, I just want us to be faithful. Going to sporting events (or being involved in sporting events), vacations, sleeping in, yardwork, etc. are all wonderful events (trust me I enjoy them as well), but they should never push our faith (and living out our faith) to take a backseat.

Instead of being a Martha and worrying about many things, let us be like Mary and choose the better part. I encourage all of us to prayerfully discern how we can be active in our faith. Instead of turning down an invitation to be involved, please pray that God will help you respond appropriately to His will.

Because if we do, and get more involved with our talents, spending more time with our Lord in prayer, and sharing our treasures, we will not only be great stewards, but we will always choose the better part!

St. Anne's Fall Festival 2025

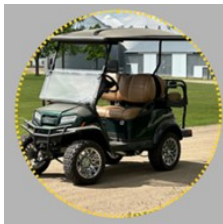

-My resident was carjacked. The man who wanted his car shot him and ended up not taking the car. Listening to him tell the story and how my resident forgave the man who shot him was amazing. - team

-During confession it felt like someone had their hand on my shoulder.

-What I liked was being around faith filled people. It brings joy, excitement and hope. Sharing experiences with others built my faith. Bringing joy to others through being generous and caring gives purpose. Events and programs are always faith based and faith building. - student



-Where did I see God? I saw God everywhere this week: entering church, waking up early, late at night during program and always in my team and mostly in my resident. This week my group and I helped a lady named Miss Sharon. She was a light from God. She showed me how to love without having to do anything. She welcomed us into her house to help her. We painted 6 rooms, stained her deck, fixed her faucet, cleaned her rock beds and fixed her mailbox. She always made us smile. - student

-I saw God in the laughter and the beautiful friendships I made this week. I saw God in the awkward silence and the conversations that sprung from it. I also saw God in my leader. - student

-Being in a room full of young people who are wanting to grow in their faith is inspiring. Seeing our resident's smiling face every day made all the hard work less hard. - student

-I saw God when I prayed, went to Mass, Adoration and 4 corners. This camp was really, really, fun. - student

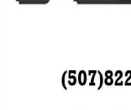
