BUFFALO HANDLING AND CHEMICAL IMMOBILIZATION

Global Wildlife Resources (GWR) is offering a **3-day** Buffalo Handling and Chemical Immobilization Course March 26-28, 2024 at the <u>Aaniih</u> <u>Nakoda College</u> in Harlem, MT. This course will focus on low stress handling of penned buffalo and chemical immobilization of free-ranging buffalo. The course will be limited to managers from tribal, government, and private programs with buffalo herds. This unique course provides the opportunity for training, networking, and hands-on experience among new and seasoned buffalo managers. This will include discussion of field protocols to be used for our field day on Day 3.

- **Chemical Immobilization** participants will join instructors and staff to immobilize buffalo from a herd of 2,000 animals on 26,000 acres
- **TPR Lab** a practice lab with awake domestic goats to prepare for the chemical immobilization lab
- **Drug Delivery Systems** opportunity to practice the most effective projectors (dart guns)
- Needle & Syringe Skills building professional habits for practical field use and human safety
- Blood Collection Practice Station practice proper techniques for successful blood collection

Course Content Includes:
