The Subject of the Sentences

In June I was blessed with the opportunity to attend a conference in Connecticut honoring the ministry of the Rev. Fleming Rutledge. Fleming—who just celebrated the fiftieth anniversary of her ordination—was one of the first women ordained in the Episcopal Church, and she has come to be recognized as one of America's great preachers and theologians. Her magnum opus, *The Crucifixion: Understanding the Death of Jesus Christ*—a massive survey of the various motifs employed by the New Testament to illuminate the meaning of Jesus' death—was named *Christianity Today*'s 2017 Book of the Year and won plaudits from across the theological spectrum, from Catholic Bishop Robert Barron to the Reformed-leaning Gospel Coalition to the more liberal *Christian Century*. Writing in the *Century*, Anthony Robinson observes, "Rutledge's book is a protest ... against what might be termed Christianity lite: against the many contemporary iterations of the Christian faith, both conservative and liberal, that don't have much in the way of theological depth and seriousness—iterations that trade a rich, world-shaking, challenging faith for what seems only a mess of trivia."

The Rev. Mrs. Rutledge is indeed an avowed enemy of "Christianity lite," especially in the pulpit. This dedication to the seriousness of preaching can make her seem intimidating, especially to new preachers. Conference attendees from Toronto's Wycliffe Theological College, where Fleming once guest taught a preaching class, shared a bit of local lore: The story goes that an enthusiastic student delivered a very earnest sermon in Fleming's class, only to hear her respond, in that unmistakable old Virginia accent, "Darling, I don't know what that was, but it certainly was not a Christian sermon." (Asked about the veracity of this story, Fleming responded, "I would never address a student as *darling*.") But despite her sometimes-fearsome reputation, Fleming has developed a personal ministry of befriending and encouraging younger clergy, many of whom I got to meet at the conference.

One of Fleming's repeated admonitions to preachers (and to all Christians) is the reminder that, "in the Christian story, God is the subject of the sentences." In other words, the Gospel is not about what *we* have done or what *we* must do; rather, the Gospel is the proclamation about what God has done decisively for us in Jesus. The Christian life is summed up not in the sentence "I found God," but in the sentence, "God found me." As Fleming's beloved St. Paul puts it: "For by grace you have been saved through faith; and this is not your own doing, it is the gift of God—not because of works, lest any man should boast" (Ephesians 2:8-9). Through Jesus' death on a Roman cross, God has undertaken to "rectify the ungodly"—to make sinners right with himself. And through his own initiative, says Fleming, Jesus makes himself known to us "as the single, unique, divine source of life and light, promise and fulfillment, strength and power."

In this conditional, performance-based, quid-pro-quo world, in which we are always being measured and too often feel that we don't measure up, it is truly good news to know that our true value and ultimate hope are not based on what we can accomplish or on the quality of our own spirituality, but entirely on what God has accomplished for us. I pray that God would be the subject of the sentences in your life's story and that you would rejoice in the story of what God has done for you. May you daily know Jesus as your source of life and light, promise and fulfillment, strength and power—now and to life everlasting.
