- But if we confess our sins, God, who is faithful and just, will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.



for there is a reward for your work, declares the LORD, and they shall come back from the land of the enemy.


There is hope for your future, declares the LORD, and your children shall come back to their own country." Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit;

Isaiah 63:7-14






