Coming Soon

"Behold, I am coming soon, bringing my recompense with me, to repay each one for what he has done. I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end." (Revelation 22:12-13)

I am writing on Thanksgiving Eve, as the smells of good cooking waft their way up the stairs up to my third-floor study, heralding the full arrival of the holiday season. But signs of the season are everywhere. In Mount Airy, where I live, the town Christmas tree is up next to the old train station and wreaths adorn the lamp posts and telephone poles. Twinkling lights are beginning to appear on neighboring houses, and peppermint-flavored treats have returned to the menu of Starbucks and Chick-Fil-A. The December calendar is already bulging with concerts and school activities and general busy-ness. It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas. In truth, it's been looking a lot like Christmas since the day after Halloween. Amid our culture's rush into "the Holidays" it's easy to forget that, in the Christian calendar, the Christmas season does not actually begin until Christmas Eve. In the church's way of keeping time, December is, in fact, dominated by an entirely different season—the time of Advent.

The word Advent means "coming" or "arrival." The first season of the church year, comprising the four Sundays prior to Christmas, Advent originally functioned as the pre-Christmas fast (much like Lent in relation to Easter), a time of prayer and self-denial in anticipation of the coming feast. But Advent is more than pre-Christmas. Advent reminds us that, just as the Son of God once came into the world in the lowliness of a human infant, so now he continues to come to us now, hidden beneath the means of grace. He will, moreover, come again—not in lowliness and hiddenness, but in glory and majesty to judge the world and to make all things new. So our observance of Advent is not merely a matter of rehearsing events that happened someplace else long ago. Rather, in remembering Israel's mournful centuries of captivity and waiting, in hearing again the Baptist's cry, "Prepare ye the way of the Lord," in recounting the Angel Gabriel's unexpected promise to a young woman named Mary, we are invited to recognize our own captivity and called to turn back to our God, and—above all—reminded that the promises of God are for us, too. The Savior comes! "Behold, I stand at the door and knock," says Jesus. Are you ready?

Consequently, there is a strongly eschatological character to Advent—it turns our attention to the last things, the end of the world and the return of Christ. The first Advent of the Lord prepares us for that second and greater Advent, and the babe in the manger is the antidote to our fears for the future. I love how this is expressed in one of the historic prayers for Christmas Day: "Grant that, as we, who joyfully receive [Christ] as our Redeemer, may with sure confidence behold him when he comes to be our judge."

I encourage you to take time amidst the business of the season to prepare for the coming of the Lord. Come to church, set aside time for Bible study and prayer with your family, keep an eye out for those in need physically or emotionally. Above all, remember that the Baby on the manger is also the Savior who is with you every day. And he is the King who is coming to reign. May he reign in your heart this holiday season—and to life everlasting.

Amen! Come, Lord Jesus.



A Grand Miracle: Daily Devotions for Advent



LCMS Stewardship Ministry

"We ask you, brothers, to respect those who labor among you and are over you in the Lord and admonish you, and to esteem them very highly in love because of their work. Be at peace among yourselves" (1 Thess. 5:12-13).

Have you finished your Christmas shopping yet? Do you have a person or two on your list that you just don't know what to give them? While I know you are running short of ideas...dad doesn't really want another tie, and your kid's teacher doesn't need another coffee mug. It can be nothing short of maddening to try to figure things out in the middle of this busy season!

As stewards of all of life and life's resources, we know that life is more than giving gifts. We stewards never want to take anything the Lord provides for granted. During this season of Advent and Christmas, it is a great idea to do whatever you can to be a faithful steward of your pastor. Even more so than the rest of the year, the demands on their time, their presence and their stewardship of the Gospel in the congregation become heightened.

The demands on pastors can wear them down and wear them out. How does the steward in the congregation serve as a faithful steward of the treasure that is their pastor? Here are a few ideas:

- Put them at the top of your prayer list. Pray that the Lord guards them against the weariness that makes them susceptible to the work of the devil.
- Make worship a priority St. Paul admonishes the Thessalonians and us to respect those who labor among us. There is no greater way to steward your pastor than to respect him enough to show up and receive what he has been sent to offer in the proclamation of the Gospel and administration of the Holy Sacraments.
- Be receptive to his work If your pastor is tasked with calling you to repentance or encouraging you to be in worship, know that he is only caring for your soul.
- Esteem him highly Take the time to thank him for his faithful service to Christ, the congregation and your family.
- Be at peace This is an easy time for even minor annoyances to get blown out of proportion and become full-blown conflict. This not only spoils the season of Advent and Christmas, but it also spoils our stewardship of the Gospel and those who serve us in that Gospel. Remember that Jesus came into the world to be the Prince of Peace. This is an act of grace and mercy. The steward seeks to reflect this toward their pastor and their brothers and sisters in Christ.

Stewardship at Christmas can be a challenge. Stewardship of your pastor during this time of the year is critical to our shared stewardship of the Gospel at a time of year when many are more open to hear and receive it.
