Day 1 Monday 19 October

Home - Auckland

Today we make our way north to Auckland picking up fellow passengers along the way, where we will overnight before our flight to Hobart tomorrow

Day 2- Tuesday 20 October

Auckland - Salamanca Place - Hobart

Today we join our flight to Hobart. Touch down in Tasmania and step straight into the charm and beauty of Australia's southernmost state. On arrival at Hobart Airport, be greeted by your Tasmanian Coach Captain and welcomed aboard our comfortable touring coach. Enroute to our hotel visit Rosny Lookout for panoramic views of Hobart set against the majestic backdrop of the Wellington Range (as time allows). Then cross the Tasman Bridge to Hobart City and before arriving at our accommodation for the next three nights.

Day 3 – Wednesday 21 October

Tasman Peninsula - Port Arthur - Geological Formations

Travel via Sorell and Midway Point to the Tasman Peninsula with its rugged coastline and historical significance. Take in magnificent views from the look-out above picturesque Eaglehawk Neck and Pirates Bay before continuing to the ruins of the Port Arthur Historic Site. Within the 40 hectares of landscaped grounds lies a rich history of Australia's past. Activities available include a guided walking tour, a short cruise around the harbour, access to the Visitor Centre and Interpretation Gallery as well as more than 30 buildings, ruins and restored gardens and houses.

In the afternoon, we visit the magnificent geological features such as the Tessellated Pavement, and the Tasman Arch and the Devils Kitchen that have been carved out by the Tasman Sea, before returning to Hobart.

Day 4 – Thursday 22 October

Tahune Airwalk - Huon Valley - Apple Shed - Mt Nelson

Today we will travel south to the Huon Valley. We walk high above the forest canopy and share the lives of the forest giants at Tahune Airwalk. The walkway finishes at a cantilevered platform, high above the riverbanks with views that extend to the mountains of the Tasmanian Wilderness World Heritage Area. Next, we travel to Huonville to be immersed in the authentic essence of Tasmania's apple history by visiting Willie Smith's Apple Shed. Enjoy lunch and time at the Apple Museum to learn about the rise, fall and recovery of the once infamous 'Apple Isle' of Tasmania and the Huon Valley, which was at its heart. On the way back to Hobart, we visit the historical Mount Nelson Signal Station, a site which holds prime position in the hills above Hobart, boasting panoramic views over Hobart city, the River Derwent and, on a clear day, down to Bruny Island and out to Storm Bay.

Day 5 – Friday 23 October

Derwent Valley - Tarraleah - “The Wall in the Wilderness” - Queenstown - Strahan

Departing Hobart, follow the Derwent Valley through hop fields and hills to historic New Norfolk. Climb the Central Plateau through highland trout-lakes country to Tarraleah, site of an early Hydro-electric scheme town. Enjoy a lunch stop here before a visit to “The Wall in The Wilderness”, an extraordinary work of art being carved out of Huon pine telling the story of Tasmania’s Central Highlands.

Next, experience the wonders of Gondwanaland during a short rainforest walk to Nelson Falls in the Wild Rivers National Park. This is followed by the spectacular drive into Queenstown, the largest west coast town; surrounded by dramatic hills and mountains and once was the world's richest mining town.

We then continue to Strahan, a harbour-side village with a dark and fascinating convict past set on the edge of the Tasmanian Wilderness World Heritage Area overlooking the beautiful Macquarie Harbour.

Day 6 – Saturday 24 October

Strahan - Macquarie Harbour - Gordon River Cruise

This morning we cruise the incomparable Gordon River into the heart of Tasmania's wilderness and the edge of the World Heritage Area. Enjoy comfortable main deck window seating on board the extraordinary vessel, Harbour Master II. Step ashore Sarah Island for a guided tour of one of the harshest penal settlements in Australia.

Follow the Gordon River through UNESCO World Heritage Rainforest, featuring ancient Huon pine, sassafras and myrtle forests, and explore the wilderness board-walk at Heritage Landing. Voyage to Hell's Gates, the aptly named harbour entrance where many early ships were destroyed by ferocious ocean swells.

On return to Strahan, there will be opportunity to explore the village including the Visitor Centre and Huon pine sawmill.

This evening, enjoy the play "The Ship that Never Was" which tells the dramatic and hilarious true story of The Great Escape from Sarah Island.

Day 7- Sunday 25 October

Strahan - Cradle Mountain - Smithton

Departing from Strahan, our journey takes us through the rugged west coast, steeped in mining history. We travel past the historic mining town of Zeehan and Tullah, nestled by the serene Lake Rosebery.

The route leads through lush rainforests, mineral-rich mountains, and the picturesque Vale of Belvoir.

Crossing alpine cattle country, we arrive at the iconic Cradle Mountain National Park. Explore the park with a guided tour to Dove Lake, nestled at the foot of the majestic Cradle Mountain. We'll also visit Waldheim, the forest home of pioneer Gustav Weindorfer.

Afterwards, recharge with a delightful meal at the charming Cradle Mountain Hotel. There will also be time to immerse yourself in Tasmania’s culture at the Wilderness Gallery. Learn about the geography, flora, fauna, and early explorers. With eight exhibition spaces, a cinema, and a fantastic gift shop, there’s something for everyone.

You will now travel through mountains and button grass plains to the far northwest coast and your overnight accommodation in the agricultural town of Smithton.

Day 8 – Monday 26 October

Woolnorth - Stanley - ‘The Nut’ - Highfield House,

Today learn about the fascinating history of the Van Diemen’s Land Co. with a visit to its original property "Woolnorth Farm", situated on the far North West tip of Tasmania. Admire the views over the outer islands from Cape Grim and breathe the officially measured purest air in the world! Visit the roaring 40's wind farm and enjoy morning tea.

Next, travel to the historic village of Stanley. This stunning town is nestled at the foot of an ancient volcanic core known as ‘The Nut’ before time to explore the quaint town with its terraces and chairlift access to the top of The Nut (ride is optional and own expense).

Our final experience for the afternoon is a guided tour through Highfield House, the historical headquarters of the early Van Diemen’s Land Co.

Day 9 – Tuesday 27 October

Penguin - Raspberry Farm - Cataract Gorge - Launceston

Enjoy the sights of Tasmania's north west as you follow the coast to the picturesque coastal town of Penguin where you can pose for a photo with "The Big Penguin". Our next destination is Anvers Chocolate. Visit the chocolate museum and gift shop, take in a factory viewing and enjoy tasting award-winning handmade truffles. We then continue to travel along the Bass Highway to Christmas Hills Raspberry Farm for a delicious lunch in a picturesque setting.

In the afternoon, explore Launceston's magnificent Cataract Gorge with its cliff-side gardens, peacocks, pools, suspension foot bridge and one of the longest single span chairlifts in the world (ride is optional and own expense).

Day 10 – Wednesday 28 October

Woolmers Estate Guided Tour - QVMAG - Launceston City Park

This morning, visit the World Heritage Woolmers Estate and National Rose Garden. This property shows a fascinating reflection of colonial life in Tasmania with the Rose Garden displaying one of the finest collections of historic roses in the southern hemisphere. After an informative guided tour, we enjoy lunch at Woolmers Cafe & Restaurant.

Next, we travel to Northern Tasmania's home of art, history and natural science – The Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery (QVMAG). The collection has been in the making since 1842 and includes significant acquisitions and donations from across the world. History, Natural Sciences and Visual Arts and Design are the key collection areas. The Tasmanian Tiger exhibit will be of special interest.

In the afternoon, choose to relax, go for a walk to the beautiful Launceston City Park or go shopping in the CBD. Dinner this evening is at a local restaurant.

Day 11 – Thursday 29 October

Seahorse World - Bridestowe Lavender Estate - Legerwood - Scamander

This morning, we tour the picturesque Tamar Valley, travelling first to Seahorse World at Beauty Point.

Here we visit a working seahorse farm which will give us unique access to these magical creatures.

Later you will cross the unique A-frame Batman Bridge and tour the beautiful northeast to Nabowla, where you will enjoy lunch at Bridestowe Lavender Estate including lavender ice-cream! This lavender is proudly Tasmanian grown, harvested and distilled for over 100 years. There is a lovely gift shop onsite.

We will now tour past agricultural Scottsdale and on to visit Legerwood and view the War Memorial Tree Carvings, honouring the fallen soldiers of the region. Continue through Branxholm, the former tin-mining turned mountain biking hub of Derby and the myrtle rain forest of Weldborough Pass before descending to the East Coast to our overnight accommodation. The hotel is uniquely positioned overlooking the picturesque Scamander Beach and calm waters of the Scamander River.

Day 12 – Friday 30 October

East Coast Natureworld - Bicheno - Hobart

After breakfast, we travel to our first stop of the day East Coast Natureworld, the perfect place to experience Tasmania's unique wildlife, including Tasmanian devils, wombats, quolls and echidnas. East Coast Natureworld sits amongst 150 acres of natural coastal bushland and lagoons at Bicheno. Enjoy a guided tour and feed the friendly kangaroos. Then, it's on to the fishing and holiday village of Bicheno, viewing the 'Gulch' fishing harbour and having lunch at the Lobster Shack, the home of Tasmania's best Lobster Roll. From Bicheno, we continue to follow the coastal Tasman Highway through Swansea, pausing at the unique convict built Spiky Bridge. Enjoy stunning views of the picturesque Freycinet National Park with its jagged pink granite peaks, crystal clear waters and white sandy beaches.

We follow the Prosser River valley through Buckland and Cambridge to cross the picturesque Derwent River into the city of Hobart and our accommodation.

Day 13 – Saturday 31 October

Hobart - Salamanca Market - Richmond - Royal Botanical Gardens

Embrace the lively energy of Saturday in Hobart, where your morning begins at the legendary Salamanca Market, a local institution and a feast for the senses. Follow the sounds of street performers and the scent of fresh produce as you wander through over 300 bustling stalls bursting with handmade treasures, local

art, fresh foods, and creative crafts. With its vibrant colours and joyful atmosphere, this is the perfect place to pick up a truly Tasmanian souvenir.

Next, we travel to the historic village of Richmond. Walk across Australia's oldest bridge, built by convict labour between 1823 and 1825. Visit the cemetery of Australia's oldest existing Catholic Church, St John the Evangelist, and browse through the many delightful craft shops, galleries and cafes. Wander the streets of this delightful historic Georgian village. Afterwards, you may choose to shop, explore the city or, enjoy some quiet moments in Hobart's Royal Botanical Gardens, vibrant with spring colours and blooms.
