16 JAN (Friday):

SAINT HILARY OF POITIERS, Doctor of the Church

(315-368)

Born to wealthy polytheistic, pagan nobility, Hilary's early life was uneventful as he married, had children (including Saint Abra), and studied on his own. As he studied the Bible for the first time, he literally read himself into the faith, and was converted by the end of the New Testament.

Hilary lived the faith so well he was made bishop of Poitiers from 353 to 368. Hilary opposed the emperor's attempt to run Church matters, and was exiled; he used the time to write works explaining the faith. He was proclaimed a Doctor of the Church in 1851.

SAINT BERARD, Priest, and COMPANIONS, Protomartyrs
(d. 16 JAN 1220)

The first martyrs of the Franciscan order, Berard and four companions had been sent by St. Francis himself to preach the gospel in Morocco. When they would not denounce their religion and continued to preach against Mohammed, the Moorish king killed them himself.

SAINT ANTHONY (OF THE DESERT), Abbot (251-356)

St. Anthony is known as the patriarch of the monastic life, for he founded the first two monasteries. Following the direction to "sell what you have and give to the poor", he gave away all his vast possessions and retired to the desert in solitude, where he lived an extremely austere and punishing life. He was assaulted mercilessly by demons, but his faith never waivered. He was persuaded to establish two monasteries and a rule only after great numbers of people sought him out for the life he led and example he provided.


