LABOR DAY

On **05 SEP 1882**, the first Labor Day parade was held in New York City. Twenty thousand workers marched in a parade up Broadway. After the parade there were picnics all around the city. At night, fireworks were set off. Within the next few years, the idea spread from coast to coast, and all states celebrated Labor Day. In 1894, Congress voted it a federal holiday.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY **REPORT ON RESOURCES RECEIVED**

Dear parishioners,

You have been very generous with your support of the Nativity St. Vincent de Paul Conference, and we thought you might appreciate a short report on our usage of resources entrusted to us.

For the first six months of this year, o1 JAN-30 JUN 2025, we received \$67,982.00 in donations from parishioners from Brown Bag Sundays and other generous donations.

During the same 6 months, we distributed \$60,000.00 in grocery store gift cards.

We provided **\$5047.00** in rent and other monetary assistance. We made over 600 "house calls", typically delivering a bag of fresh produce, a bag of frozen protein and bread and a bag of dry staples, along with the gift cards. We estimate that on average we deliver to approximately 500 people per month.

All food items are provided by Second Harvest Food Bank - at no cost to us. All "shopping" and delivery of food/gift cards is accomplished by a group of fellow parishioners who volunteer a few hours each week to do this extremely rewarding work. We have tasks that can generally work around busy schedules. If you have an interest in learning more about what we do and perhaps getting involved, please contact Dan Winnike at 650/714-4644.

As always, we very much appreciate the opportunity to manifest your charity and concern for our neighbors.





PRAYER OF ST. GERTRUDE THE GREAT

Our Lord revealed to St. Gertrude that the following prayer would release 1000 souls from Purgatory each time it was said.

"Eternal Father, I offer You the Most Precious Blood of Your Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the Masses said throughout the world today, for all the holy Souls in Purgatory, for sinners everywhere, for sinners in the Universal Church, those in my own home and within my family. Amen."

Chapter 2, Article 1 (Celebrating the Church's Liturgy) sections 1156-1158:

1156 "The musical tradition of the universal Church is a treasure of inestimable value, greater even than that of any other art. The main reason for this pre-eminence is that, as a combination of sacred music and words, it forms a necessary or integral part of solemn liturgy." The composition and singing of inspired psalms, often accompanied by musical instruments, were already closely linked to the liturgical celebrations of the Old Covenant. The Church continues and develops this tradition: "Address . . . one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with all your heart." "He who sings prays twice."

1157 Song and music fulfill their function as signs in a manner all the more significant when they are "more closely connected . . . with the liturgical action," according to three principal criteria: beauty expressive of prayer, the unanimous participation of the assembly at the designated moments, and the solemn character of the celebration. In this way they participate in the purpose of the liturgical words and actions: the glory of God and the sanctification of the faithful:

1158 The harmony of signs (song, music, words, and actions) is all the more expressive and fruitful when expressed in the cultural richness of the People of God who celebrate. Hence "religious singing by the faithful is to be intelligently fostered so that in devotions and sacred exercises as well as in liturgical services," in conformity with the Church's norms, "the voices of the faithful may be heard." But "the texts intended to be sung must always be in conformity with Catholic doctrine. Indeed they should be drawn chiefly from the Sacred Scripture and from liturgical sources."
